




Fall to Spring Benchmarking Data & EOY Principal's Goals Update









In ELA, from Fall to Spring Benchmarking the colony schools increased Tier 1 by 3 students and remained the same in Tier 3.







In math, the colony schools had an increase in Tier 1 by 11 students from Fall to Spring Benchmarking and decreased Tier 3 by 3 students.

Principal's Instructional Goals & Action Steps

Academic Goal for the 22-23 School Year:

By June 1, 2023, Big Sky and Glendale Schools will decrease students in ELA and mathematics Tier III by 25% and increase Tier 1 by 25% as measured by Aimsweb end of year benchmarking assessment.

WAY TO GO BIG SKY & GLENDALE TEACHER!!

Although the Colony Schools did not achieve their ELA goal we did move 3 students from Tier 2 to Tier 1. In mathematics, the colony schools EXCEEDED the goal of increasing Tier 1 by 25%! They moved 11 students into Tier 1 and reduced Tier 3 by 3 students.
