Strengths:

- 3rd Grade ELA and Math above state average--brought up overall scores
- Sped ELA higher than the state
- small class sizes
- ELA up 6% from previous year
- School goals--staff will create and maintain a welcoming environment for all families and community members and a distributed leadership process will be used to build the capacity of others in the school were both reached and will be having new goals

Weaknesses:

- math was a decline for 4th and 5th grades
- attendance was 80% lower than expected/wanted
- Science declined 25%

- DAL embedded strategies in all areas
- 4th and 5th grade math blocks are structured differently--also has the help of a math coach and PD for teachers
