Mrs. Wysong invited everyone to the Babaloo Community Concert on Thursday, March 16th at Panther Den, it is sponsored by Pana Education Foundation. Title I & II grant amendments are still pending approval. Ms. Zueck highlighted the letter she received from the Abraham Lincoln Museum praising the behavior of our 5th grade students while on their field trip. Ms. Zueck also highlighted the drumming program the Mrs. Tynan has started at Lincoln School. Mrs. Ellis highlighted that 7th and 8th grade girls Volleyball are both Conference Champions and are heading to Regionals. 7th grader Ian Rickett will be moving on to the Regional Spelling Bee. Mr. Miller's Archery club team won the Middle School Championship and Aubrea Rhodes was "shooter of the year". The Junior High's new monitoring program is making great progress. # Building and Transportation- Mrs. Lori Ade
