Accountability Resource Gains Traction

During the week of January 24th, Unity High School implemented a new process to focus on increasing academic success and course/assignment completion. Each Monday, the High School Office staff identify any students that are receiving any grades below a C-. All students in that boat are then scheduled into an accountability resource until their grades are back up

above a C-. As soon as their grades are up, they are released from the accountability resource. On the flip side, students that are achieving with Cs or better are allowed to sign up for various Privilege Resource locations. The goal is to help students grow in their ability to prioritize and manage their time. So far, we have already witnessed extremely positive changes.
