**SUBJECT:** Behavior Tool for Classroom Documentation

The Student Services Department is requesting to purchase Panorama Behavior Logging, a behavior documentation tool for teachers. The total purchase price is \$52,552. The purchase price includes annual licenses for each school and training for implementation and use of the online platform. This would be a tool integrated into our already existing platform, which teachers and schools are using to analyze student well-being and climate, as well as document behavior interventions and monitor student progress.

As outlined in our Elevate28 priorities, a system of Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) in a school or district is crucial in providing a proactive and preventative approach to behavior management. By focusing on positive reinforcement, clear expectations and consistent strategies, PBIS creates a school culture that promotes a respectful and inclusive learning environment. This approach not only addresses behavioral challenges effectively but also fosters a sense of belonging, improves overall student well-being and enhances the overall quality of education. Part of creating a system includes identifying students in need of behavioral support, additional instruction and intervention within the classroom. In order to identify these students, teachers need a means of documenting student behavior in their classrooms in a manner that is not only user-friendly and straightforward but provides crucial integrated information in order to determine appropriate next steps.

Additionally, as defined in Utah State Statute 53F-4-207, schools need a tool that integrates criteria for early warning indicators, including behavior as part of a student profile to allow a teacher to easily identify a student who may be in need of intervention and to assist school districts and individual school to use the results through analysis in planning, evaluating, and enhancing programs.
