



Hospitalizations


Thirty-seven (37)GHS students were hospitalized this year. Of those, nine (9) were hospitalized more than once.










LEVEL OF CARE

Quick Fact #1

Students who are hospitalized receive approximately one hour of academic instruction per day.

Therefore, if a student is hospitalized for one week, s/he misses approximately 30 hours of instruction.

Quick Fact #2

The school is responsible for providing all work and instructional materials to the hospital or homebound tutor.

If 20 students require this level of service per semester, the school is responsible for gathering this for approximately 140 classes. Additionally, the school staff need to ensure that this work is turned in and graded.

Quick Fact #3

School staff work diligently to re-integrate students after hospitalization. Often, students feel overwhelmed because of the amount of work and class time they have missed.

Individual Counseling Sessions with Guidance Counselor	8
Individual Sessions (5 or less) with Social Worker	10
Individual Sessions (6 or more) with Social Worker	8

Five (5) students medically withdrew from at least one (1) class <u>and</u> failed at least one (1) class.

Seven (7) students failed at least one (1) class, but did not medically withdraw from any classes.


Eight (8) students medically withdrew from at least one (1) class, but did not fail any classes.

Thirteen (13) students were able to complete and pass all of their classes. (Out of these 13, only one was hospitalized more than once.)


