**Spring Activities**

- WEM Night of Excellence is Wednesday May 26, beginning @ 6:30 pm
- Baseball, Softball & Track regular seasons wrap up this week. Despite a two week later start our spring activities got to play full seasons!
  - Baseball Subsections begin next Monday May 31. (Yes - Memorial Day in Region 1A!) Dates & Locations TBD Friday 5/28.
  - Softball playoffs begin Tuesday June 1 Dates & Locations TBD Friday 5/28. If all goes as planned the girls will play for a Gopher Conference Championship this Thursday at home!
