Summarize the results of your most recent survey(s) of staff, students, and families.

Parents highlighted several strengths of the school, including strong communication with families, a caring and supportive staff, and the benefits of a small-school environment where students are known individually. Many respondents noted that their children feel safe, valued, and supported academically. Families also appreciated small class sizes, the ability to group students by skill level, positive relationships, and access to both academic and extracurricular opportunities.

Areas for improvement reflected a wide range of perspectives. Some families expressed a desire for more advanced learning opportunities, increased professionalism, and expanded extracurricular options beyond sports. Others mentioned concerns about inconsistent expectations, excessive screen time, limited lunch time for some grades, and communication regarding school closures. A few responses raised concerns about student discipline, bullying, supervision, and fairness within sports programs. Several parents also noted operational suggestions, such as improving pickup procedures and offering more hands-on learning experiences.

Additional comments reinforced themes already noted, including requests for expanded staffing (such as an additional math teacher), greater fairness in athletics, improved communication, and more opportunities for parent involvement. A few responses also encouraged the school to address food waste and strengthen expectations around student movement within classrooms. Overall, the feedback reflects appreciation for the school's strengths alongside clear opportunities to strengthen consistency, communication, enrichment options, and equitable experiences for all students.
