

Annual Report 2016-17

Submitted to Minnesota Department of Education

- Served 9,630 community members birth to senior
 - 7,710 in 2015-16
 - 6,145 in 2014-15
- Worked with 42 groups using facilities

 - Bringing 18,213 visitors into the district
 - 17,911 visitors last year

Audit Fiscal Year Ending 2017

Community Education Fund o4

- When considered with all district funds, community education is 3.9% of the budget.
- With a budget of just over \$2 million, Community Education added \$187,632 to the Fund Balance.
- The fiscal year ended with a positive Fund Balance of over \$500,000.
- Support the General Fund by contributing 18.5% of CE budget – the charge back in other districts is in the single digits.

Facility Improvements

Accomplished with help from athletic

 At DEC, added diggers, climber and musical equipment to playgrounds.

Added lockers and a T-swing at Wildwood.

 DEC rink additions include a new gate, rink rules, tree/brush trimming, new fencing.

- Replaced dilapidated DEC shed and made improvements to existing shed.
- Updated OH Anderson gym.






