RE: Updated Language for Graduation Requirements of Kalamazoo County EMC students

Previously, students were required to have a "hold-back;" a Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) required course that they removed from their 11th or 12th grade schedules that they would wait to take in their 5th year (13th grade). As Early College programs have grown statewide, more clarification has been provided and more districts are moving toward removing the "hold-back" and utilizing local board-approved requirements for graduation in order to avoid punitive consequences for students who may need to withdraw from the Early College program.

MMC Mathematics Requirement: Each pupil must successfully complete at least one Mathematics course during his or her final year of high school enrollment.

MMC Mathematics FAQ #5: Early middle college students must take a mathematics or mathrelated course in their 5th year.

Proposed Changes (beginning with Cohort 4)

beginning with students completing Gr. 13 in June 2021 (current sophomores)

- graduation audit for high school diploma is based on the graduation requirements of the diploma granting school which includes MMC
- students must successfully complete at least one math or math-related course in the 5th year (grade 13)

Math course can be from college or high school in final year.

Local school district has discretion for approval of Math course.
