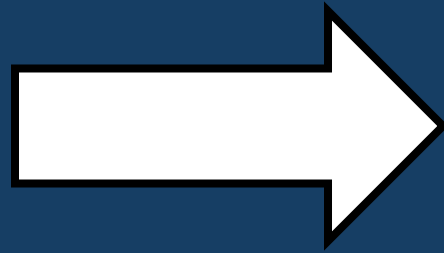


# MIDDLE SCHOOL WRESTLING

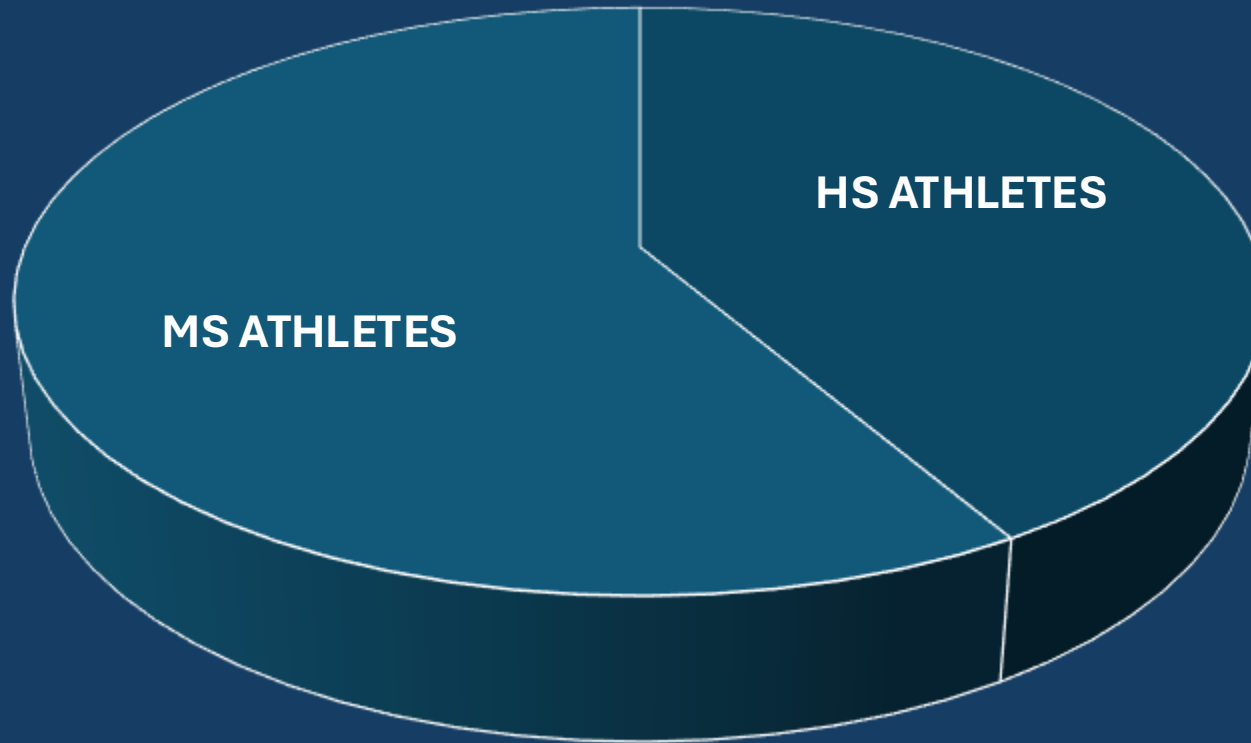

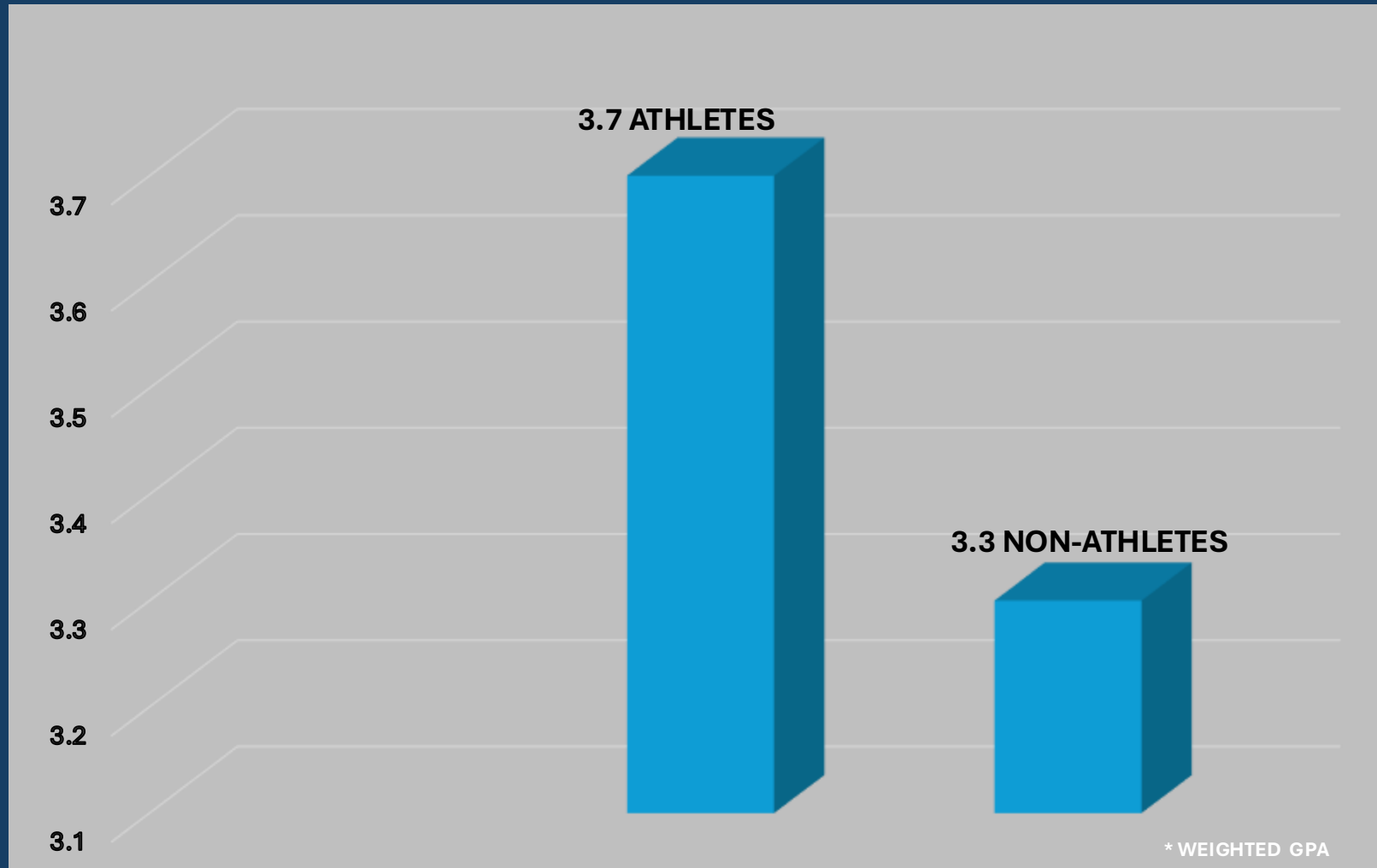
