Goal #1

State Goal

By May 30, 2024, students of Duchesne High School will increase the percentage of students proficient in ELA, Math, and Science on state year-end assessments by 2% from the previous year and increase the average ACT score from the previous year by 2 points and have a graduation rate of 95% or higher.

Throughout the 2023-2024 school year, DHS staff will monitor the level of student learning using classroom assessments, RTI data, district benchmark assessments, and state benchmark assessment data. They will adjust instruction to meet individual student needs throughout the year.

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

To accomplish this goal, we will:

1. Purchase Chromebooks and additional technology and provide training for teachers to help them utilize the technology for student learning.

2. Purchase materials and supplies so students can engage in hands-on learning experiences.

3. Provide students with the means for an additional attempt on the ACT. Additionally, ACT preparation sessions will be implemented.

4. Filter and select teacher professional development that will be most beneficial to students. The training will be scheduled and conducted in such a manner as to help the most teachers possible in the most needed areas.

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5. Provide a personalized education for students by opening online options and credit recovery options so that each student will be enabled to graduate from high school. We will hire a part-time paraeducator to coordinate the online work of students. In addition, we will pay a stipend for before and after school tutoring for Math and ELA.
