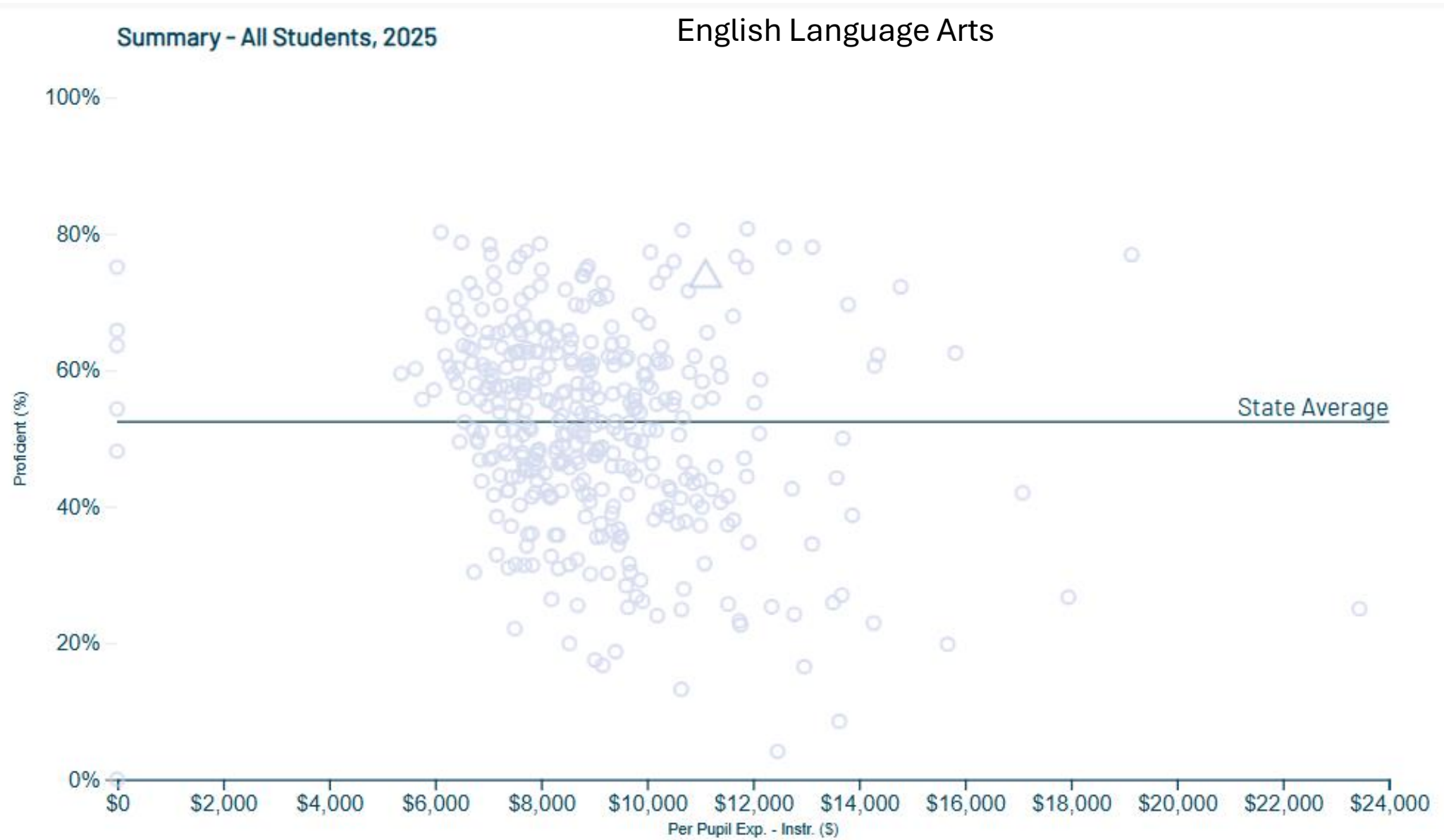

What's New?

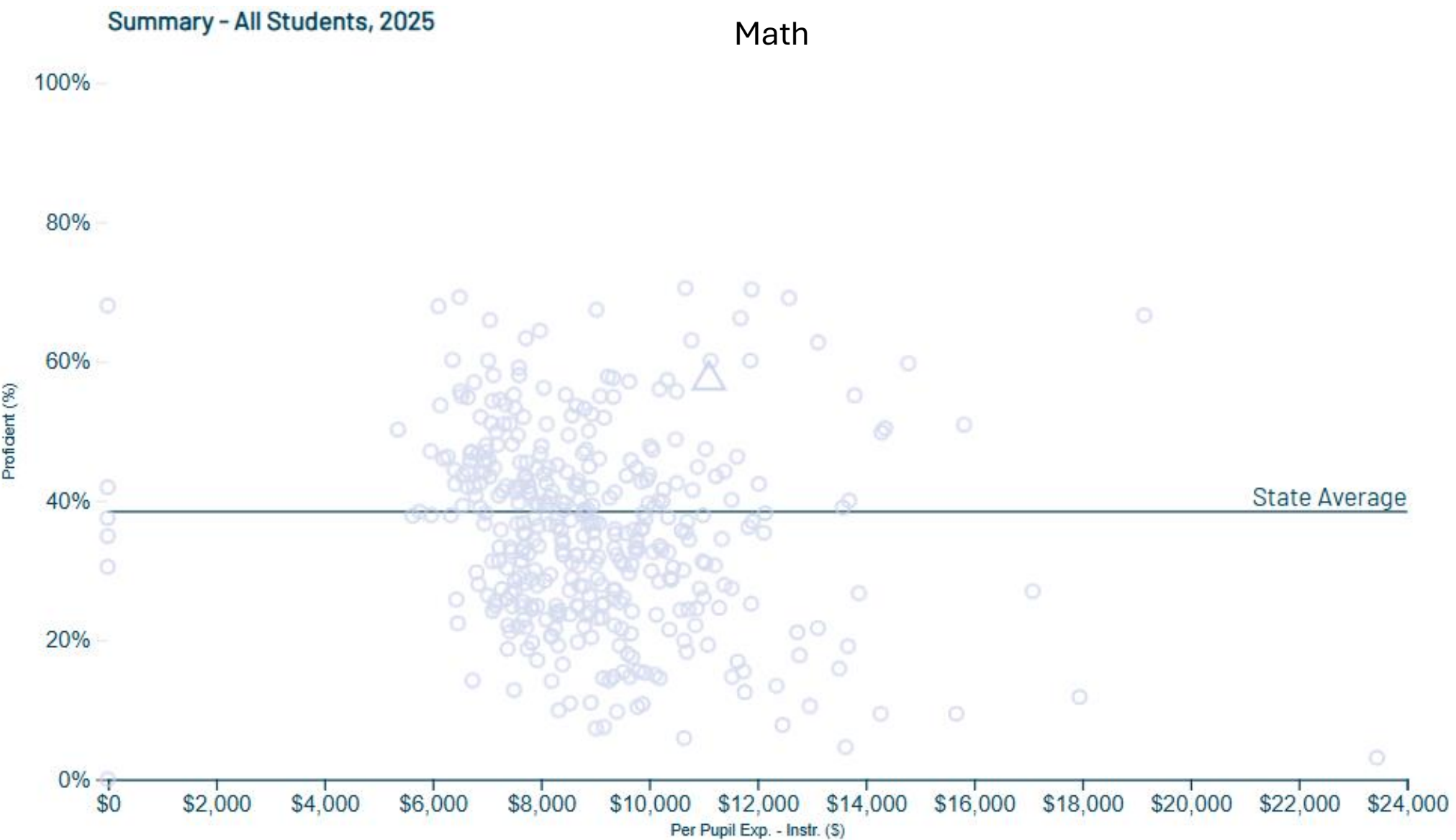


- Same Test, New Cut Scores and Proficiency Ranges
 - There is significant variation in rigor across grades and subjects, ranging from the 45th national percentile to the 69th national percentile.
 - Most districts will see a steady drop in math proficiency from Grade 3 to Grade 8 that is unrelated to student, school, or district performance.
 - Most districts will see higher proficiency in ELA compared to math, despite being equally competitive compared to the state and nation.
