### **Behavior**

There were 18 behavior referrals written in the month of January. There were 37 referrals recorded in January of 2025. There was one out of school suspension in January.

### **Academics Awards Assembly**

Following weather-related rescheduling, BRIJHS held the first of two Academic Awards Assemblies for the 2025-2026 school year on January 29 and 30. During this assembly, students in grades 4–6 were recognized for excellent attendance (95% or higher) and for meeting or exceeding standards on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) in mathematics and/or ELA. Students in grades 7–8 were recognized using the same criteria, with additional recognition for Honor Roll and High Honor Roll achievement. All recognized students received a Certificate of Excellence. A second Academic Awards Assembly is scheduled for May to recognize students for excellent attendance and progress toward growth goals on the i-Ready assessments established in the fall.

### **BRJH Volleyball Update**

BRIJHS will host the SVC 7th Grade Volleyball Showcase on Saturday, February 21, beginning at 9:00 a.m., with additional matches scheduled throughout the morning. The event will feature eight teams competing in four seeded matchups. The SVC 8th Grade Volleyball Showcase will be hosted by Tri-Valley Middle School on Friday, February 27, and will also include eight participating teams. Postseason play will follow, with the 7th Grade Regional hosted by Milford on February 28 and the 8th Grade Regional hosted by St. Matthew's–Champaign on March 7.

### **IAR and ISA Testing**

BRIJHS is scheduled to administer the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) beginning March 9. The assessment window includes five total assessments: three in mathematics and two in English Language Arts. All assessments are timed and administered digitally on Chromebooks. The Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) will be administered to students in grades 5 and 8 following Spring Break. The school looks forward to reviewing these results as a measure of student learning and growth following a full year of instruction at BRIJHS.

### **Prince Charmless**

BRIJHS will present the spring theatrical production, *Prince Charmless*, a comedic performance featuring a lighthearted storyline centered on a well-meaning but hapless prince, his anxious parents, a cast of eccentric princesses, and an unexpected ogre. Auditions are scheduled for February 18 and 20 from 3:15–5:30 p.m. Following cast selection, rehearsals will begin on February 24 and will take place daily from 3:15–5:30 p.m. A mandatory parent meeting is scheduled for February 27 at 5:15 p.m. Performances are scheduled for April 23–26.
