This Spring, WCJC will graduate approximately 350 students, an



Student Success - Transfer Edition


One of our Key Performance Indicators to gauge overall student success is the rate at which our students transfer to a four-year university within three years of entering WCJC. For approximately half of our students, this is their goal upon arrival at WCJC and, WOW, do we deliver!

Three-Year Transfer Rate; AY 2021



Data published in the 2021 THECB Higher Ed Almanac indicates that WCJC has maintained a continuous, and significant, increase in the percentage of WCJC students who transfer to a four-year institution. For AY 2021, the data shows that 37.3% of WCJC students transferred within three years of entering the College, approximately 10 percentage points higher than for Texas two-year institutions as a whole. Moreover, this rate was the highest of all colleges in the Gulf Coast region of Texas!

Percentage of Transfer Students Who Maintain 2.0+ GPA; AY 2021



Of the WCJC students who transfer to a four-year institution, data from the THECB show that 90% maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher at their transfer college or university during the following academic year! Moreover, for students who entered WCJC designated as "Not College Ready", 88% maintained a GPA of 2.0 or higher following their transfer. This is a huge testament to the educational foundation they receive at WCJC. Go Pioneers!
