Dear Parents,

As our year begins to draw to a close, I want to thank each of you for taking the time to read this message. Your child's education is so important and sometimes this is our only means of communicating a variety of important information to each of you!

Clothing reminders:

As our weather warms up, please remind your child about appropriate school dress:

No spaghetti straps or tank tops with low cut necks or under arms.

No backless or bare midriff tops. Belly buttons should not show. Pants also need to be cut high enough for modesty both in the front and back.

No flip flops or other strapless shoes. Shoes need to have a strap around the back of the foot as well as across the top in order to protect feet. Closed toes are best for playground safety.

Students who have inappropriate shoes may not be allowed to participate in outside recesses or other P.E. type activities for their safety.

Shorts should be fingertip length or longer.

No see through fabrics or those with multiple holes unless another shirt is underneath for modesty.

No Clothes with large or gaping holes that expose skin.

Student Behavior

Don't forget that student behavior tends to change in ways that aren't always positive as the weather warms and the end of the year nears. It is important that you follow up on any concerns voiced by the teacher, the bus driver, or the office. We want each child to make safe and appropriate choices while at school or on the bus right up to the end! We appreciate your efforts to help us with that issue. Some students who have repeated or serious referrals will not be allowed to attend field trips or participate in other fun events. This includes our PBS Field Day on June 4th.



Our Artist in Residence is Laura Rich. She is returning this year on May 17-28 to work with grades 3-5. Next year she will work with grades K-3. We have purchased a set of drums for our school thanks to money from Josephine County's Cultural Coalition Oregon Cultural Grant. Laura is also going to be training some staff on the drums as well. We will have an assembly for kids to show their skills on May 28th at 12:30pm just before the Pride Assembly. Stay Tuned!

Classroom Placements

We are getting ready to consider placements for next year. The Projected start date for students is August 30th. We are still interested in your input concerning your child's placement. As always, if you have specific information you would like to share with me concerning your child's placement for next year, we have a form you can fill out in the office. The forms may be picked up beginning May 10th. The forms should be carefully filled out and returned to the school office no later than May 24th for consideration. When we build classes we consider many factors so we end up with well balanced classes. We try to form classes based on balancing academic needs, social needs and emotional needs. We attempt to balance classes for the numbers of boys and girls and even duplicate names when we can. Much thought goes into this process. This year, the teaching teams will get together and make tentative placements based on several different staffing scenarios. Once we know which scenario will actually take place, final adjustments will be made. The date those class lists will be posted is August 23rd. Remember, those parents with serious concerns should fill out the forms. Requests for certain teachers are not generally considered. It is impossible to form well balanced classes and honor all parent requests. We do our very best to consider the specific information you provide. Please note: It is very unlikely that any changes to a child's placement will be made once class placements have been determined if an information form was not turned in by the parent by the due date of May 24th.

Lindergarten Round-Wo

If you have a child that will be five years old by September 1, 2010, please plan on coming to the Madrona Kindergarten Roundup on Thursday, May 13th from 12:00 - 2:00pm. You will need to bring <u>original</u> Birth Certificates, immunization records, and your new Kindergarten student when you come. We will meet in the office to fill out enrollment forms, make copies of Birth Certificates and immunization records. Then you will visit the Kindergarten classroom and meet Mrs. Strickler, our Kindergarten teacher, to get an idea what Kindergarten is all about. We look forward to seeing you and our new Kindergarteners here!

PBS Field Day Coming on June 4th!

We had a fabulous time at our PBS "Trashion Show" in early April! The costumes were creative and just plain wonderful! Kids learned to show and share their creativity and talents. Many monthly PBS ticket holders helped run this special event! Students who had earned the assembly through good behavior choices were invited to attend. Almost our entire school was able to attend with only 12 students missing the event. Our hope is to have even more students earn their next PBS event which is a school wide field day on June 4th.

Again, the standard is set that from April 5th until June 3rd good student behavior will count towards earning the opportunity to join in our field day events. The standard is no referrals, bus citations and 9 or less visits to the Ed lab for behavior during the time period. Students who get one referral or bus citation can earn back the opportunity to attend if behavior improves and stays solid prior to the event. Thanks for helping your child to make good choices each day at home and at school. Less poor behavior choices at school translates into more time spent on learning. Thanks for your positive support for our kids. Go Madrona Hornets!

The Field Day is being designed by our PBS team. Staff has had input and the team will finalize the plans for the day soon. Events will be fun, some will be challenging and many will just plain be silly, but the idea is to celebrate the joy of learning and

having fun together. If it is a warm day, we plan to get a little wet, too! Parents will be needed to help with this day so let your teacher or the office know if you are willing to volunteer. We will have a parent sack lunch that day so you can stay and eat with your child picnic style! Order forms for the sack lunches will come home closer to the event. Events will be set up from 8:00am until each grade level's lunch recess time. It promises to be a wonderful day together. Encourage your child to do his/her best to earn the privilege of attending by making great behavior choices each day at school and on the bus.

No Child Left Behind

Our school receives federal funds for Title

the right to request the following information:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher is providing instruction
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived
- The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degrees and certificates
- If your child is receiving Title
 One services from
 paraprofessionals and if so,
 his/her qualifications

Attendance Procedures

Parents, please remember that if you pick up your child early from school, write a note, or call us to report an absence, you must indicate why they are leaving/absent. Our attendance procedures require us to use codes to indicate whether or not the absence is excused. If there is no reason listed, we have no other alternative than to mark it as unexcused. Thank you for your help.

Madrona Summer Library Hours



We are fortunate to be able to fund library hours through our Title One dollars. Jenniffer Richardson will be running the program this year. The library will be open Tuesdays and Thursdays for seven weeks. The program hours will be from 8:00-12:00. Students may each check out up to 10 books a week. New kindergarten students may also participate. The dates are as follows:

All students must be accompanied by an adult. The adult must stay with the student during his/her visit to the library. Students may not be dropped off. This is an excellent opportunity to keep your child's reading skills sharp and growing! Students who struggle with reading especially benefit from reading for 30 minutes or more each day. This is an easy, no cost way for parents to give their child an academic boost. Free meals will again be offered to community children during the library operating hours.
