

### **Updates From the Social Studies and Music Classes at LMS!**

#### **6th Grade Social Studies Update**

Hello 6th grade social studies families!

I cannot believe how fast the year has been flying by! We are currently at the end of our Ancient Rome unit where students will be taking their final test on the reasons for the fall of Rome. This is in a document-based format using the RACES skill. This unit we have has the chance to use VR to see the Colosseum, Roman Forum, and Greek Acropolis. We have learned about Roman inventions, Pompeii, and many other interesting events. Be sure to ask your students about it:)

Our final units of the year are about the Mesoamerican civilizations of the Olmecs, Mayans, Incas, and Aztecs. Please continue to help remind your student at home about their weekly homework assignments. It is important they are completed on the paper and turned in each week for a homework grade.

#### 7th Grade Social StudiesUpdate

Our 7th grade social studies classrooms have just wrapped up another unit!

In this last unit, students explored concepts like the idea of "Social Darwinism" and how it led to America's Imperialism Era. We explored the motivation behind the United States becoming an imperial world power, and students applied their knowledge to answer a variety of questions about imperialism for the unit assessment.

Looking ahead, our classes now begin one of our favorite units of the year!

In this next unit, we will have a bunch of engaging and interactive activities, including materials from WWI provided by the 1st Division Museum at Cantigny AND the chance to experience the trenches in an immersive classroom experience.



#### 8th Grade Social Studies Update

The next unit for 8th grade Social Studies covers the Cold War. The students will focus on the question, "How do government policies, protests, and media affect daily lives across generations?"

Students will explore how the aftermath of WWII led to the Cold War. They will explore the effects the Cold War had on the world from 1945 to 1960 and how the Cold War changed Society in the U.S.

To assess this unit, students will be asked to choose who they think has the most power or responsibility. Is it the media, government,or the people?

The assessment will ask students to analyze these perspectives and think about the motivations for each within the context of a historical event

#### **Music Department Update**

The Music Department had some very successful performances in March: the Choir (with guests from Gary School) and Mariachi had very successful concerts, and Band and Orchestra students prepared solos to perform for their families and professional judges.

Eighth Graders in the last two months also traveled to the elementary schools to perform for the 3rd-5th graders, letting them know about joining these music groups for next year.

Mariachi los Rayos and Mariachi la Tormenta, in addition to many community events, also performed at the first ever ILMEA Large Group Mariachi Festival in South Elgin and received some great feedback from a professional Mariachi

The Leman Jazz Band also performed and sounded great at our Spring Musical, *High School Musical Jr.*, and at the High School's Jazz Showcase.

Band, Choir, Orchestra, and Mariachi are also all preparing for their end-

of-year concerts in late May or early June. The Choir will perform their final concert on May 27 and Mariachi on May 28 in the Leman Cafetorium. Orchestra will have their final concert on June 2 and Band on June 4 in the Bishop Gym at West Chicago Community High School.

We're excited about these concerts capping off a busy and exciting year!


