Principal's News by Dr. Jeanne Svobodny

We made it to March! February was a battle to say the least, wasn't it? I know all the school closings and delays created challenges for you parents with child care arrangements. Hopefully we won't experience another winter like this one until your children have all graduated from high school! Children thrive on consistency and routine so all the disruptions have made learning challenging for many. It is hard to get learning momentum going and sustained with all the cancelations.

As you probably know, the school board made some decisions regarding our make-up days at their February 19th board meeting. Students will now have regular school days on Friday March 29, Thursday April 18, and Monday April 22.

Teachers will have an additional make-up day on March 1. The 18th and 22nd were listed as potential snow make-up days on our district calendar so these make-up days don't come as much of a surprise. We realize and understand that some families may have made plans to be away for these days.

In the Board's discussion, they did not think it would be beneficial for student learning to add additional days on to the end-of-the-school year.

You probably have noticed that many districts have used e-learning days this year when the weather has necessitated school cancelations. This concept is being considered by administration for next school year. Our research into flexible learning or elearning days has resulted in an awareness of pros and cons which administration is weighing carefully. Nothing can replace the learning that occurs face-to -face with a teacher. One concern is that the assignments would be quality or authentic learning and not just "busy work". There is also a concern about what to do if children don't have access to the internet to complete assignments, what to do if multiple children in a family need to use the internet with one device in the home, or if day care providers aren't' able to assist with the learning tasks.

Teachers will be providing input as these discussions continue. No one likes to make up weather related school cancelation days so if we can determine how to

make flexible learning meaningful, it will be strongly considered. A district needs to apply to the Minnesota Department of Education to obtain approval of using flexible learning days. Districts are allowed up to 5 flexible learning days in a school year.

Currently, Minnesota requires that schools be in session for so many minutes, not days as many people believe. Computing the lost minutes of instruction due to our school cancelations with the minutes gained by adding the make-up days, students at D-E Elementary School are in session more minutes than required. Whew!

Conferences that were scheduled for Monday, February 25 have been rescheduled for **Tuesday March 5.** Conferences are scheduled at their original times unless individually changed with the teacher.

Stay tuned...winter isn't over unfortunately!

New Fountas & Pinnell Reading System



I just wanted to update you on the implementation of our new literacy curriculum system. Our K-2 teachers have been working very hard to switch from our old Reading Street program to this new program which is structured very differently from what we were using for 10+ years. The literacy system provides materials for large and small group instruction, shared reading, phonics and word study, book clubs, and writing.

The feedback I hear most from K-2 teachers is that our students LOVE reading the books. The pictures in the books are amazing and the content is very interesting to students. Teachers say that students "can't wait" to read the next book which is a very good thing! The structure of the program allows teachers to teach to students' individual skill levels more accurately than our old system did.

Fountas and Pinnell are in the process of expanding their literacy system and instructional materials to 3rd—5th grade. The Fountas & Pinnell materials are very expensive so it worked out well for us that we were able to stagger our purchase and the implementation of the new system over several years. The materials for 3rd—5th grade will be arriving in August so 3rd—5th teachers will begin the implementation process next year. These teachers are currently using one strategy of the new program (Guided Reading) but will now have the actual Fountas & Pinnell books to use during guided reading along with all the other additional components of the new program. We are looking forward to our whole school using the same literacy in-

A huge thanks to Nick Truxel, our district's Teaching and Learning Director, and to Peter Dodds, our PreK-12 Instructional Coach for their support to teachers as they become familiar with the use of the new components of Fountas & Pinnell.

Lost and Found



Please review the attached chart which is a visual of our expectations regarding conditions and a student's return to school. You may want to put this on your refrigerator to refer to when your child exhibits the symptoms. We do want students to be in school, however, if they are sick and have conditions that will spread to others, it is best to keep them at home where they are comfortable until they have met the return to school requirements.

Thank you for your help. It truly takes everyone working together to stop the spread of virus-es/conditions in an elementary school.

Why Read 20 Minutes at Home Each Day?

Because it makes a huge difference in a student's success in school! Please take note of the book graphic that is attached to this issue of the News & Notes to see the importance of reading at home.

If students start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of **60** school days, Student B will have read for **12** school days, and Student C will have read for **3**. The gap in skills that students gain when reading for 60 days verses 3 days is huge! Please help your child have the advantage of staying ahead instead of getting behind.
