February has been a busy month for Browning Middle School students. BMS sent a group of American Indians into Math and Science students to the University of Montana campus through the Gear Up program. The students attended STEM activities, job shadowing of professors, an Anatomy and Physiology class and Evolution class. Students experienced on the job skills for Pre-Veterinarians, dissected cow eyeballs in a college class, and participated in a sensory activity involving lasers and hand eye coordination. This educational experience exposed the BMS students to varied skills, professions and notetaking in a university setting. Gear Up will be sponsoring a STEM activity in the next month and the students are being encouraged throughout the 6 STEM classes that are held at Browning Middle School.
