



2017-18 ENROLLMENT REPORT

POLICY ISSUE / SITUATION:

Each school year on the final school day of September the District tabulates the enrollment totals for each grade level and school. These figures represent the District's baseline enrollment for the school year. The attached memo and tables present a snapshot of the District's enrollment for the 2017-18 school year, as well as a comparison with the prior school year.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the School Board receive the 2017-18 Enrollment Summary. Staff will be available to answer questions during the Board meeting or as a follow-up.

District Goal: WE empower all students to achieve post-high school success.

2017-18 School Year: Enrollment Summary

The following is a summary of the Beaverton School District's general education enrollment for the 2017-18 school year.¹ Detailed tables are provided in subsequent pages.

- Overall, District enrollment declined by 105 students from the previous year (-0.3%), with declines at the elementary level offset to some degree by increases at the high school level. Middle school enrollment was unchanged.

Elementary School Level (K-5)

- Elementary grades (K-5) experienced a decline of 271 students (-1.5%) between 2016 and 2017. This was the second year of decline in the elementary grades, by about the same number of students.
- 2016-17's Kindergarten class, (the incoming 1st grade) grew slightly, by 30 students, which was below the historic increase of 7-8%. This was the second consecutive year in which a Kindergarten class did not grow significantly as it moved into 1st grade. This has contributed to the decrease in the K-5 student population, as larger cohorts in higher grades matriculate. There were also decreases in the incoming 2nd and 3rd grades.
- In North Bethany, Springfield saw a large drop in K-5 enrollment, a result of an attendance boundary split to accommodate the newly opened Sato ES.
- The attendance boundaries for Hazeldale, Nancy Ryles, Scholls Heights and Cooper Mountain were also adjusted for the 2017-18 school year. There were no appreciable changes in their enrollment, because the boundary changes affected largely undeveloped land.

Middle School Level (6-8th)

- Middle School grades overall (6-8th, including all Options and SUMMA programs) were relatively stable, with a net overall decline of -2 students. This is a slowdown from prior years, which saw steady increases in the 6-8th grade classes.

- 6-8th grade enrollment in the District's three K-8 Schools (Aloha-Huber Park, Raleigh Hills, and Springville) was overall stable, with a slight decline of -7 students. Raleigh Hills experienced the largest decline of 13 students (-7.2%).
- Enrollment in the Rachel Carson program saw a minor decline of 2 students.
- The District's SUMMA programs declined in enrollment by 79 students (-9.3%). This was a steeper than experienced the prior year.
- The 6-8th grade population in comprehensive middle school programs increased by 44 (+0.7%).
- Conestoga MS led with an increase of 66 students (7.4%), followed by Highland Park (39 students, +5%). Stoller MS, the District's largest middle school, saw a small increase of 4 students.
- Options Middle School programs, including ACMA, HS2 and ISB, each experienced a growth in enrollment, with a total increase of 42 (+3.6%).
- HS2 led with an increase of 36 students (+10.6%), with slight increases at ACMA and ISB.

High School Level (9-12th)

- High School grades (9-12th, including Options schools) experienced the most growth of the three school levels with a net increase of 168 students (+1.5%). This continues recent trends of growth at the high school level.

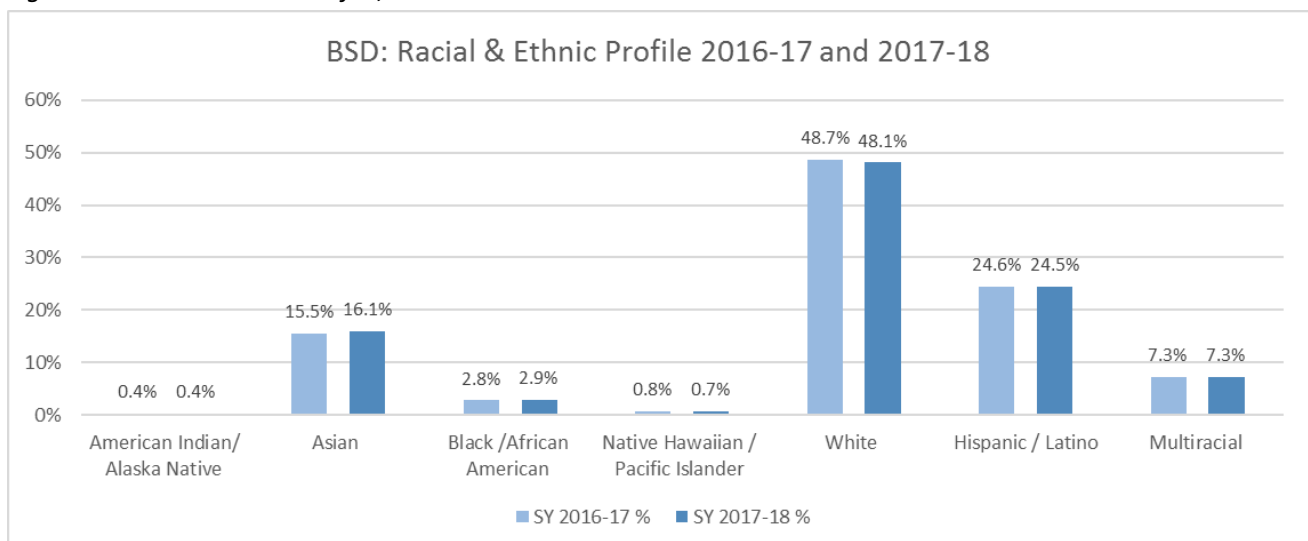

- Most of the growth was in the comprehensive high schools, with a total increase of 209 students (+2.1%).
- Aloha, Beaverton, Southridge, Sunset and Westview saw a net decline in student population, as the new attendance boundaries were implemented. Mountainside High School opened with 873 students, made up of 9th and 10th grades only. With the ongoing matriculation of larger upper classes who were grandfathered to their original boundary, each of the five original high schools will continue to experience a decline in population.
- The District's five high school Options programs saw a decline in enrollment of 41 students overall (-2.8%).
- The largest decline was at ACMA, where there was a decline of 33 students (-8.9%).
- ISB experienced a slight increase in enrollment of 10 students (+2.6%).

Racial & Ethnic Profile

- The District's racial and ethnic make-up in 2017-18 is substantially the same as last year.
- There was a slight increase, proportionally, in the Asian population, and a decline in the White population. Other groups saw minor shifts.

Socio-Economic Profile

- Title 1 schools (elementary schools with high levels of poverty) experienced a net decline of -243 students (-3.1%) from 2016-17 to 2017-18, while enrollment declined less so at non-Title 1 schools.²
