# LIBRARY MEDIA PROGRAM RESEARCH

AASL Standards For The 21<sup>st</sup>-Century Learner “School libraries are essential to the development of learning skills.

DPI Wisconsin School Library Summit Report Findings showed that not having a school library media program was just as much a negative as low socio-economic level in terms of higher student performance on standardized tests and greater overall academic achievement.

Statistical Facts From Library Research Service DPI of Colorado “Increased library staff links to higher (CSAP) scores. CSAP (Colorado Student Assessment Program). Seventeen other states had similar findings.

WI. DPI Study on Student Learning Through Wisconsin School Libraries (1.) Schools with full-time certified LMS and full-time library aides have higher performance on the WKCE, (2) Schools where the library media specialist spends more time on instructionally-related student and teacher activities have higher WKCE scores. (3.) Schools with greater library media program resources for collections and technology have higher performance on the WKCE. (4.) Teachers who aligned and integrate the (ITLS) to their lessons found school library media programs more helpful to student performance. (5.) Library media specialists help students acquire unique skills not taught in the classroom and information and technology skills essential for students in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

District Administrator Magazine, “Transitions to Digital Media” The explosive growth of anywhere-anytime digital content only increases role of the LMS and the School Library. The LMS and other media staff play a pivotal role for students, guiding them through search processes and helping them find appropriate, reliable, vetted resources in print and digital format.

PEW STUDY, nov. 2012. The role of “information navigator is becoming ever-more important”. LMS are “custodians of information”, helping students sift through oceans of information and teaching them how to find and vet appropriate content for research in this digital-age.

International Reading Association (IRA), adds that the school librarian is “a digital age lynchpin,” more important than ever to maintaining the integrity of information so integral to teaching and learning. School libraries should be centers of innovation and experimentation.
