Background Information

AIPAC	Janice Ericson, President of AIPAC, is recommending that the district allocate \$15,000 of the FY24 American Indian Education Aid funds towards the Indigenous Liaisons for Red Wing Public Schools. Cell Phone Policy	Policy 524 <i>Internet Acceptable Use and Safety Policy</i> is one of the policies that has 2024 Legislative changes. Attached is our current policy with the MSBA recommended changes in redline.
	Below is the note from MSBA explaining the changes: In 2024, the Minnesota legislature enacted a law requiring that school districts adopt a policy on students' possession and use of cell phones in school by March 15, 2025. This law does not state that school districts must incorporate specific language or provisions in the school district policy.
	MSBA recognizes the common practice of setting forth cell phone rules in a student handbook or similar document. This Article directs school administration to establish cell phone rules, which the school board may require be presented to the board for approval. This approach enables administrators to craft flexible and specific rules that are specific to grade levels and buildings. The school board may choose to set forth general principles regarding cell phone use in this Article.
	Under the new law, the Minnesota Elementary School Principals Association and the Minnesota Association of Secondary School Principals will collaborate to make best practices available to schools on a range of different strategies to achieve the goals stated above.

Building and Programming Updates

Colvill

Sunnyside

- Sunnyside is a busy place this summer! Kids Junction is operating for the summer at Sunnyside. They have around 350 total students registered, and an average of 170 200 attend on any given day.
- Summer School and Extended School Year programming kick off on Monday, 7/15 at Sunnyside. Programming will run Monday through Thursday mornings for the next three weeks.
- Sunnyside is also one of the District's sites for the summer meals program. Kids age 18 and younger can eat breakfast and/or lunch onsite at Sunnyside at no cost all summer long. At Sunnyside, breakfast is served from 8:00 9:00 am, and lunch is served from 11:00 am 12:30 pm each day, Monday Friday.

Burnside

- The entirety of Burnside is being re-carpeted this summer!
- Burnside will celebrate its 30th year this fall.
- Burnside students will participate in Jumpstart and ESY programing at Sunnyside beginning July 15 August 1.

Twin Bluff

- Twin Bluff hosted the Child's Play Theatre production of "Twinderella" though CER. Seventeen students participated and put on two shows at the end of their week of practices.
- Twin Bluff students will participate in Summer School at Sunnyside July 15th through August 1st.
- The custodians are rocking the summertime schedule and deep cleaning all areas of the school. The completed areas look amazing and are ready to welcome back our students this fall.

High School

• Last week Summer School wrapped up. 73 students from Red Wing HS, 5RO, and River Bluff participated, earning 64.5 credits back towards graduation the equivalent of 129 classes.

Tower View

• Waiting to hear back from Minnesota Department of Education on the alternative learning program paperwork.

Activities

- Registration for fall activities will begin on July 22.
- Fall Sports begin on August 12.
- We are continuing to look for some fall coaches.

Buildings & Grounds

- Burnside Phase 1 is moving along well, this phase includes the library and attached rooms.
 - Old carpet has been removed and replaced.
 - Entry ways have new walk off carpet that has been installed.
 - Phase 2- We have all the furniture and curriculum materials moved from rooms and are ready to proceed when Phase 1 is complete. They will start by removing old carpet in this area.
- Sunnyside-The new panels have been installed for the new freezer and cooler.
 - Electrical has been updated.
 - Flooring for the freezer is scheduled for install the week of July 8th.

- With the Red Wing Waterpark closed for over 18 days this summer due to flooding, Kids Junction and the Red Wing Lifeguards worked together to schedule time at Twin Bluff allowing our older kids the opportunity to still enjoy swimming at the local "pool" for weekly field trips.
