Discuss and Consider Action to Designate Ten Nonbusiness Days for Consideration of Public Information Act Requests for Calendar Years 2023 and 2024 December 18, 2023

1. Background:

House Bill (**HB**) 3033 of the 88th Regular Session of the Texas Legislature impacts governmental entities' response to public information act. Complying with the Texas Public Information Act (TPIA) requires adherence to timelines that reference "business day," but no formal meaning had ever been established. The law now formally defines the meaning by clarifying business days do not include the following:

- Weekends Saturday or Sunday
- National holidays (i.e., New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, President's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day)
- State holidays (i.e., Confederate Heroes Day, Texas Independence Day, San Jacinto Day, Texas Emancipation Day, Lyndon Baines Johnson Day, the Friday after Thanksgiving, and the 24th and 26th of December)
- Optional holidays of Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, or Good Friday if the public information officer of the governmental body observes the holiday
- Friday or Monday before or after a national or state holiday if the holiday falls on the weekend and the governmental body observes the holiday on that Friday or Monday
- Up to an additional 10 designated nonbusiness days per calendar year on which administrative offices are closed or operating with minimum staffing

2. Process:

Based on a recommendation by administration, the designation of 10 nonbusiness days for TPIA per calendar year for the school district must be made by the board of trustees.

The superintendent recommends approval to designate ten nonbusiness days for consideration of Public Information Act Requests for calendar years 2023 and 2024.
