### **Jostens**

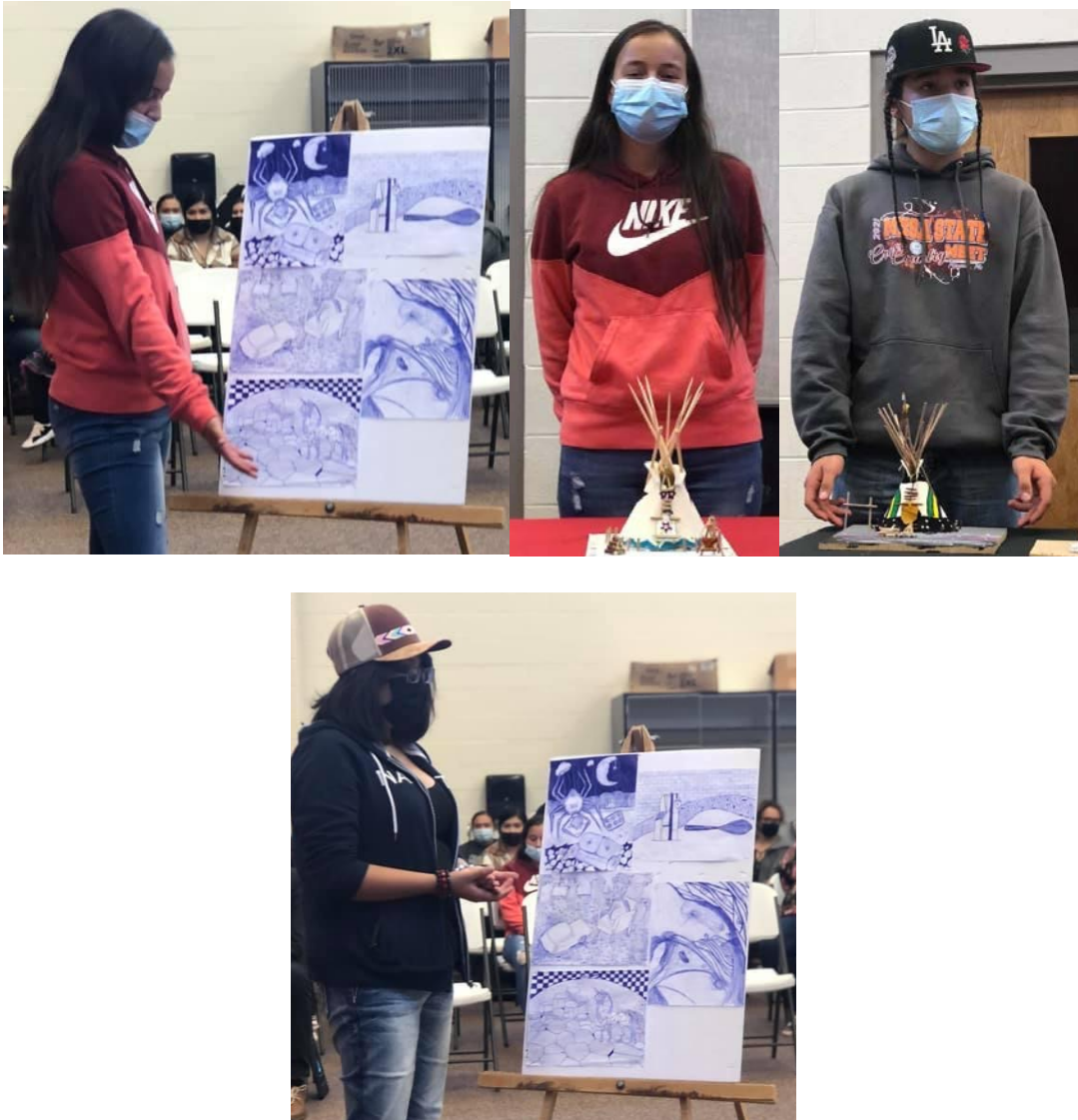
