	The Superintendent or designee shall implement, monitor, and eva- luate electronic media resources for instructional and administrative purposes.
AVAILABILITY OF ACCESS LIMITED PERSONAL USE	Access to the District's electronic communications system, includ- ing the Internet, shall be made available to students and employees primarily for instructional and administrative purposes and in ac- cordance with administrative regulations. Limited personal use of the system shall be permitted if the use:
	1. Imposes no tangible cost on the District;
	2. Does not unduly burden the District's computer or network resources; and
	3. Has no adverse effect on an employee's job performance or on a student's academic performance.
USE BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC	Access to the District's electronic communications system, includ- ing the Internet, shall be made available to members of the public, in accordance with administrative regulations. Such use shall be permitted so long as the use:
	1. Imposes no tangible cost on the District; and
	2. Does not unduly burden the District's computer or network resources.
	Members of the public who are granted access shall be required to comply with District rules, regulations, and policies governing ap- propriate use of the system. [See CQ(REGULATION) and CQ (Exhibit)
ACCEPTABLE USE	The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement ad- ministrative regulations, guidelines, and user agreements consistent with the purposes and mission of the District and with law and poli- cy.
	Access to the District's electronic communications system is a pri- vilege, not a right. All users shall be required to acknowledge re- ceipt and understanding of all administrative regulations governing use of the system and shall agree in writing to allow monitoring of their use and to comply with such regulations and guidelines. Non- compliance may result in suspension of access or termination of privileges and other disciplinary action consistent with District pol- icies. [See DH, FN series, FO series, and the Student Code of Con- duct] Violations of law may result in criminal prosecution as well as disciplinary action by the District.
INTERNET SAFETY	The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement an Internet safety plan to:
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	1.	Control students' access to inappropriate materials, as well as to materials that are harmful to minors;
	2.	Ensure student safety and security when using electronic communications;
	3.	Prevent unauthorized access, including hacking and other un- lawful activities;
	4.	Restrict unauthorized disclosure, use, and dissemination of personally identifiable information regarding students; and
	5.	Educate students about cyberbullying awareness and response and about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking Web sites and in chat rooms.
