Report on Violent or Criminal Incidents


TEC, §51.403(e), requires postsecondary institutions in Texas to report student performance during the first year of enrollment after high school graduation to the high school from which students graduated. Districts must include this information in the annual report.

The THECB publishes a report listing this information for each high school in Texas (sorted by county and district) on its website. The first page explains the purpose of the report and data calculation methods.

Please note THECB anticipates releasing an updated report mid-January 2024. If data for a district are masked due to small numbers of students, that district should still publish its section of the report, showing the masked data, just as it would publish any data that are masked in the TAPR.
