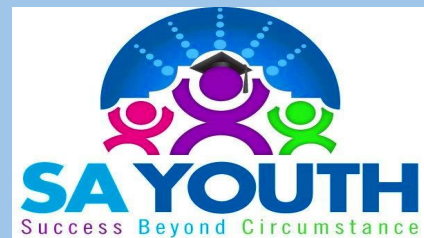

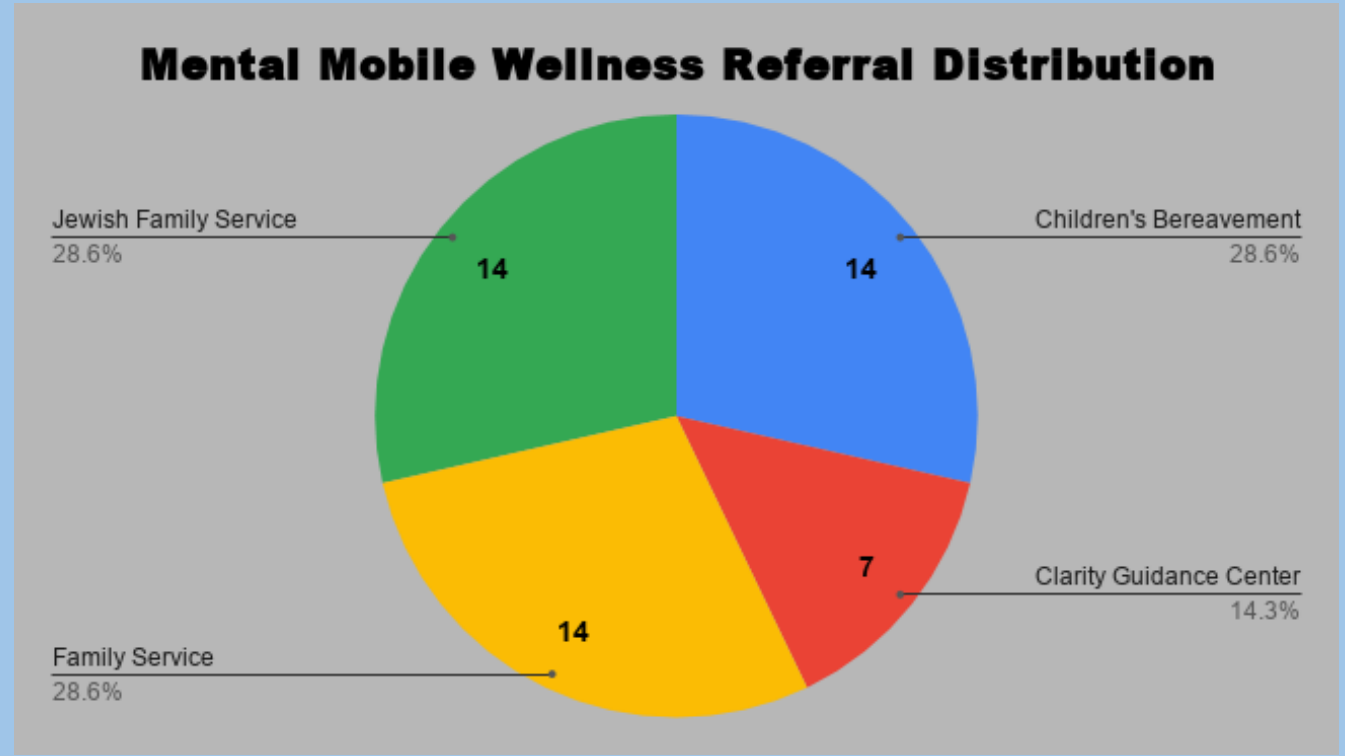

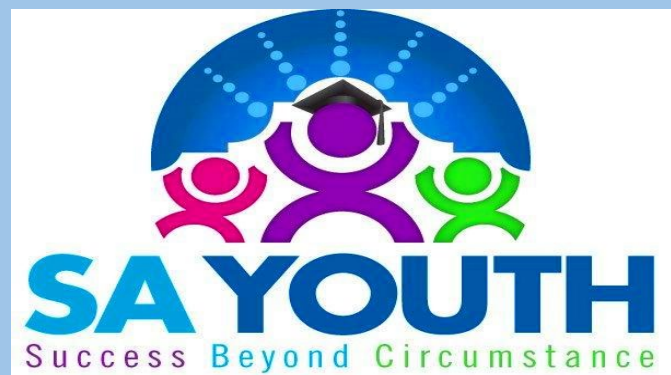


- **Mission:** To provide a safe and nurturing shopping experience for teenagers in need. The target age group is 12-21 years of age.
- They have 3 city locations- SA Threads, Austin Threads, and Houston Threads
2 mini locations- South San ISD and Edgewood ISD
- This will be year two of our partnership.
- Serviced 75 students at the SA Threads CARE Zone location in the 2019-2020 school year.





- **Mission:** SA Youth empowers San Antonio's high-risk youth and young adults by providing quality educational programming in a safe environment.
- SA Youth provides year-round youth development programs during non-school hours that focus on academic achievement, character development, and healthy lifestyle choices.
- SA Youth focuses on 3 goals: Improve Educational Achievement, Develop Healthy Lifestyles, and Develop Character and Values.
- During Phase I they are servicing over 500 elementary and 42 Kazen students either virtually or in person.
- SA Youth will have begin in-person programming at Dwight, Shepard, and Zamora in the Spring of 2021. SA Youth will expand to offer high school programming in the fall of 2021.





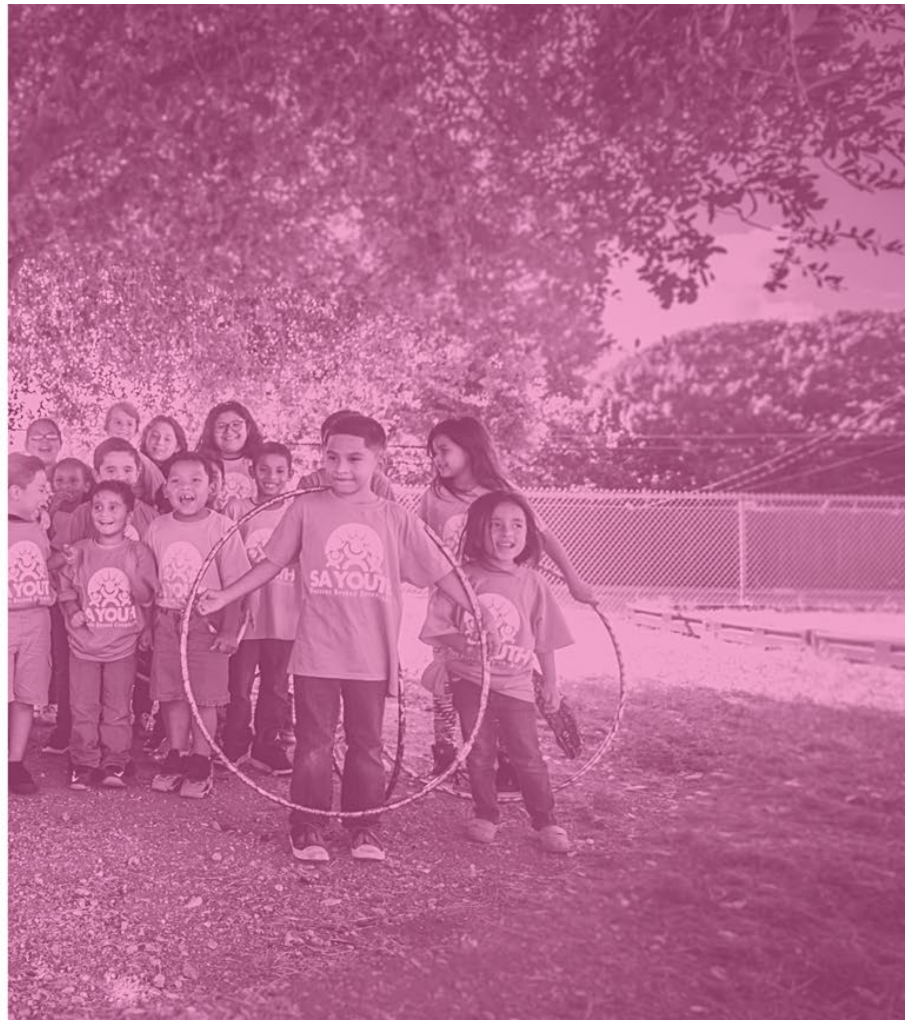

FALL 2020 - ELEMENTARY

SUPPORTING STUDENTS WITH TEKS-BASED ENRICHMENT & REVIEW ACTIVITIES:

- Providing safe, engaging after-school programming for Phase 1 students
- Maintaining connection and programming with students still learning from home
- PROGRAMMING:
 - 2 hours in-school support
 - 3 hours after-school enrichment



FALL 2020 - ELEMENTARY

COLLABORATING WITH SSAISD:

- Participating in District Re-Opening Committee
- Meeting with administrators to align after-school safety procedures with campus
- Assist with improving the campuses overall attendance and our efforts included calling parents that were both part of our program and those that were not part of our program



FALL 2020 - MIDDLE SCHOOL

KEY FOCUS AREAS: ACADEMICS, ATTENDANCE, DISCIPLINE



42 STUDENTS ENROLLED

- KAZEN: 18 (6 in person)
- SHEPARD: 12
- DWIGHT: 7
- ZAMORA: 5

Among the 18 Kazen students:

- 14 passing ALL classes
- 4 students earning A/B honor roll
- 2 students all A's
- 3 SA Youth students made Student of the Week

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUCCESS STORY

- **The greatest example of what we have accomplished involves a young man who joined SA Youth at the end of August from DAEP. Not only was he in DAEP but he was failing every class. Since starting up with SA Youth, this student has had perfect attendance, passing grades, has been awarded Student of the Week (first week out of DAEP), AND he will finish the 9 weeks on the A/B Honor Roll.**
