What We Know about Creating Safe Schools

Positive relationships with students make our schools safe.

Our staff is invested in creating safe and supporting learning environments for all District 97 students.

Training, common language, and staff capacity to exercise in-the-moment options make our schools safe.

There isn't a playbook for emergency situations, but we can prepare.





Building safety capacity is an ongoing process.

We are continuously working to enhance safety across all District 97 buildings.

Building Safety Capacity in District 97

What We've Done

Conducted initial security walks in all schools

Required emergency drills in all schools

Engaged principals to determine physical safety needs

Developed of threat assessment teams and completed CSTAG Level 1 and 2 trainings

Established communication protocols and templates related to safety

Entered partnership with West 40

What's In Progress

Training and implementation of "I Love U Guys" Standard Response Protocol

Developing district-wide emergency response flip chart

Auditing Access Control System (door locks and key cards) to optimize building security

Establishing consistent visitor management procedures across all buildings

Implementing relocation/reunification plans and training



District 97 Safety Principles and Staff Expectations



Safety Principle #1:

Staff members monitor the safety of our students and are clearly visible as members of the district team.

Safety Principle #1

Expectations for Staff



All staff members must wear their district-issued IDs during the work day.

Before-school, after-school, and lunch supervisors must:

- Wear safety vests.
- Actively move around the space.
- Carry a two-way walkie-talkie during the supervision period.



Safety Principle #2:

Buildings must remain secure throughout the day and visitors must have a student-centered purpose.

Safety Principle #2

Expectations for Staff

All visitors must follow schools' entry protocol—sign a visitor log, show ID and wear a visitor badge.

(Board Policy 8:30, Visitors to and Conduct on School Property)

All exterior doors must be closed and locked at all times.





Safety Principle #3:

Only **two people** are authorized to speak officially on behalf of the district—the superintendent and the designated communications lead.

Safety Principle #3

Expectations for Staff



During a crisis, all media inquiries must be sent to the designated district communication leader:

Amanda Siegfried
Senior Director of Communications
and Engagement

Staff members may not communicate with the media on behalf of the district.

(Board Policy 8:10, Connection with the Community)



Safety Principle #4:

We use common training, language and visuals in our response to emergency situations.

Safety Principle #4

Expectations for Staff



All staff members are prepared to support staff and student safety through standardized response protocols, while being empowered to exercise in-the-moment options.

All District 97 staff members attend designated safety trainings, participate in emergency drills, and review shared resources/materials.
