Answers:

Mental Health Resources

What is the district budget for the counseling department? (Trustee Saad) The 2019-2020 budget for the counseling department is \$838,548.

Do we track the number of hits for the counseling department website? If so, how many hits on the website? (Trustee Saad)

We have not previously counted website hits. Web services is creating an account for Counseling to be able to view its website "hit" count.

What is the attendance like for the COPE sessions? (Trustee Donald)

These are very small groups with 5 - 8 students participating in the group session.

What company provides the Campus Well online magazine for us? (Trustee Saad) CampusWell/Student Health 101 is privately owned and is published by College Health Services, LLC.

Can we add counseling information to the student app? (Trustee Gomel) Counseling is working with Strategic Initiatives to explore the options available f

Counseling is working with Strategic Initiatives to explore the options available for the app.

When tracking students' issues, if students are presenting more than one issue, how is it tracked? (Trustee Hardin and Trustee Saad)

The Counseling Service's database takes into account all student concerns. A student can have multiple concerns presented each session and all of them are included in the reporting data.
