From what schools or communities do the students come?	Coronado K-8
How will students be recruited?	Third and 4th grade students are presented with different instrument choices they make learn. They may select Ukuleles and be placed in Choir/General Music to be a part of learning to play Ukuleles. Additionally, middle school students currently enrolled in choir or music. 
What criteria will be used in selecting students for the program?	This program is available to all 4th and 5th grade elementary and 6-8th middle school students as an elective. Students showing an interest in learning to play the Ukulele, singing, reading and composing music will all be accepted into the Choir/General music with Ukuleles classes. Students accepted in the class will also demonstrate positive attitude toward learning a new instrument, positive classroom behavior and an effort to promote a positive learning environment for peers.
List your concrete and measurable student enrichment outcomes?	One objective is to use Ukulele lessons to foster students' general music skills. To measure this student outcome, there will be concrete class assessments (rubrics, worksheets, assignments, peer evaluations, and performances) based on students' goals in playing the instrument, singing, reading music, written assignments, and writing music or composing. Another objective of playing the Ukulele while singing. Students will accompany each other. This will be measured with a rubric during class, and informally during quarterly concerts and performances. 
What are your criteria for assessing each outcome?	The criteria used for assessments is based on mastering the following objectives. Students will be able to: 1. Demonstrate knowledge of the parts of the Ukulele. 2. Define and demonstrate finding frets. 3. Demonstrate knowledge of notes on strings. 4. Write and play basic chords in tab and clef notation. 5. Use specific strumming techniques. 6. Accompany self and other singers. 7. Create, compose, and play simple chord progressions. 8. Compose and play a simple melody.
