Stakeholders working with Roosevelt Jr. High School recognize that skills in ELA, especially Reading fluency and comprehension are crucial to the success of students in all academic areas. We have noticed that many students have fallen behind in these skills, especially those who missed critical instruction during the pandemic. Once students learn these skills, they will be able to read informational texts and use information from that text to solve real-world problems in all academic areas. 2022 ELA Proficiency - RISE Data 6th Grade - 25% 7th Grade - 18% 8th Grade - 24%

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

1. RJHS will implement a Reading Intervention class in 6th grade. Students will be selected based on data from Acadience Reading data.

2. RJHS will hire intervention aides to provide Reading supports in the classroom.

3. RJHS will hire intervention aides to provide Reading supports to all ELL students.

4. All ELA teachers at RJHS will receive LETRS training through a self-paced, on-line course. Teachers will also be able to earn their ESL endorsement through Southern Utah University.

5. RJHS will continue to provide on-line curriculum resources to teachers (Lexia Power Up, Habitudes)

6. RJHS will continue to provide technology supports to teachers (chromebooks, projectors) as needed.
