- Years 4 & 5 district will help supplement the program

Program Components

- ♦ Academic Assistance
- Enrichment
- Family and Parental Support Services
- ♦ College and Workforce Readiness

Additional Information

- Sites were selected based on free/reduced lunch percentages (40% or higher)
- Must serve 100 students at each site
- ♦ An 80% attendance rate is required.
- Activities must be a minimum of 45 minutes
- Program must be in operation 15 hours per week outside the school day
- Snacks will be provided
