

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Fleming Families,

We have had an exceptional start to the new school year. As information and data is beginning to solidify from the 2009-2010 school year, I can announce that we have continued the recent tradition of increased student performance and decreased disciplinary concerns. Once again, Fleming has received an Outstanding rating on the Oregon State School Report card.

Academically, our students continue to show great academic success and achievement across the content areas. All of our scores in reading, writing, math, and science were well above the state average and in some cases stood out as the highest in all of Southern Oregon! Although that is an outstanding accomplishment on its own, I like to state that the data doesn't illustrate one of the most important parts of the true academic picture. Individually, our students experience phenomenal academic growth as measured by analyzing individual, fall to spring assessment data in the content areas. Although some of our students may not be proficient as identified on the grade level assessment, the amount of growth they are experiencing is a major academic accomplishment that is not going unnoticed. One of our goals at Fleming is for all students, regardless of their ability level, to experience academic growth.

As your student may have mentioned, we spent a great deal of time during those first couple weeks of school reinforcing Fleming's PBIS program. This program emphasizes a teach, re-teach approach to discipline. Within this program we

have established a consistent set of expectations reinforced by all of the adults on our campus. We believe that our time spent in Advisory Class revisiting these PBIS expectations has had a profound positive impact on the climate of our building as well as playing a role in our academic and behavioral success.

Any school year is defined with successes and challenges. Fleming experienced its first challenge on Friday, September 24th. As you know, Fleming was asked to go into a "lock down" due to an unpredictable situation occurring off campus. First of all, I'd like to thank our staff for doing an outstanding job of locking our campus down swiftly and maintaining this status for over an hour. Please understand our top priority during a lock down is to keep the students as well as the staff of Fleming Middle School safe and secure. ATTENTION PARENTS OF

7TH GRADERS

Oregon Law added new requirements for immunizations as of the 2008/2009 school year. All 7th graders who have not met the requirement need to have one additional vaccine or an appropriate medical or religious exemption. Please check your child's records to be sure he/she has the following:



Tdap Vaccine – 1 dose

Tdap offers protection against three serious diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (whooping cough). The Tdap vaccine is given to adolescents and adults 10-64 years old. It is different from the DTaP, which is given to children younger than 7 years. Your student will need one dose of Tdap if it has been at least five years since receiving their last Tetanus containing vaccine. If your student does not have the Tdap shot, contact your child's doctor or call the Josephine County Health Department (541) 474-5353 to make an appointment.

It is important to get an early start on updating your child's immunization information. All updated information should be sent to Fleming Middle School. If you have any questions you can call (541) 476-8284 and talk to Maria at Fleming.




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IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT MEDICATIONS

When you child must take prescription and/or non-prescription medicine at school, please follow these steps.

- The parent/guardian must bring the medicine in person to the office and fill out a medication administration form. Additionally, the parent/ guardian must pick up the container when the child has completed the course of medication.
- Medicine must be in its original container.
- The parent/guardian must fill out the appropriate form with instructions/ permission for the school to administer the medication.
- The parent/guardian must inform the school in writing of any changes in medication instructions.

At no time may a student be in possession of either prescription or non-prescription medications while at school. All medications must be administered through the office. The only exception to this policy are students who must have inhalers or other medications with them because of life-threatening conditions. The office <u>MUST</u> be notified if your child is in this category.
