FYI:

By the numbers -

We had 157 students enrolled at Blue Ridge High School this year. Average Daily Attendance Rate for the month of May was 94.1%. Our average attendance for the year was 91.7%. As a comparison, last year's average attendance was 89.6%, so this was a nice increase!

Chronic absenteeism is a section in our school report card from the state that affects our overall rating on the report each year. A student is considered "chronically absent" if they miss more than 10% (18 days) of school either excused or unexcused. Here is what that has looked like for BRHS in the past 4 years:

- SY22 30.5%
- SY23 28.7%
- SY24 32.3%
- SY25 28.3% (means that 28.3% of our students this year were classified as chronically absent)

Nice to see a large drop in this number for this past year. Hoping that we are able to continue to see this number trend in this direction.

14 total students failed a total of 23 classes during 2nd semester. This is down from 33 total students and 63 total classes in the first semester.

97.6% of courses taken were passed during 2nd semester. This is up from 94.3% during 1st semester.

Discipline data for the year (Also data from SY24, SY23):

- Detentions 148 (112, 251)
 - Slight increase over last year, but still down quite a bit from 2 years ago.
- Saturday Schools 1 (11, 6)
- In-School Suspensions 12 (15, 26)
 - Nice to see this trend.
- Out of School Suspensions 3 (4, 13)
 - Also a good trend.
- Electronics referrals 88 (98, 118)
 - 45 students received a referral for electronics.
 - o 21 students reached at least level 2.
 - o 10 students were on a contract.
 - There were 12 contract violations for the year
