Recommendation for School Lunch Prices Increase – \$0.10 For the 2025–2026 School Year

Background:

In accordance with the National School Lunch Program: School Food Service Account Revenue Amendments related to the *Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010*, school meal prices must align with the federal reimbursement rate's weighted average price \$3.85

Upon consultation with the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), it has been confirmed that our district does not receive any non-federal contributions into the lunch program. Funds received through incentive programs are not deposited into a separate school account.

ISBE Guidance:

- **\$0.10 Cap:** ISBE can only require a \$0.10 increase in lunch prices to maintain compliance.
- School Food Authority (SFA) Discretion: While ISBE mandates a \$0.10 minimum increase, the SFA has the authority to raise prices beyond this amount with administrative approval.
- For the 2025–2026 school year, ISBE recommended a \$0.10 increase.
- The recommendation remains consistent for the 2025–2026 school year.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board approve an increase of \$0.10 in both lunch and breakfast prices beginning in the 2025–2026 school year, with continued increases of \$0.10 in each subsequent year through 2027–2028, in accordance with ISBE guidance and the federal mandate.
