Student Handbook

Bullying Definition/Consequences

Bullying occurs when a person intentionally injures, demeans, humiliates, or isolates another through physical contact, words or other means repeatedly and over time.

Students engaged in bullying or at the elementary level will be subject to one or more of the interventions provided for in Level 2 Behavior of the Elementary Community Code of Conduct.

Students engaged in harassment or bullying at the middle school level will be subject to one or more of the following disciplinary actions:

- First Violation Restitution
- Second Violation 1 day of In School Suspension (ISS)
- Third Violation Saturday School
- Fourth Violation 1-3 days Out of School Suspension (OSS), 1 Expulsion Point (EP)
- Subsequent Violation 3-5 days Out of School Suspension (OSS), 1 Expulsion Point (EP)

Students engaged in harassment or bullying at the high school level will be subject to one or more of the following disciplinary actions:

- First Violation Saturday School, 2 Days In School Suspension (ISS), Parent Involvement (PIA), or 2 Bus Suspensions
- Second Violation 1-3 days Out of School Suspension (OSS), 1 Expulsion Point (EP)
- Third Violation 3-5 days Out of School Suspension (OSS), 1 Expulsion Point (EP)
- Fourth Violation 5-10 days Out of School Suspension (OSS), 1 Expulsion Point (EP)
- Subsequent Violation Consideration for Expulsion (7 EP)
