Gaga's Born This Way Foundation. Clinton CUSD 15 will review the pilot program that teaches students a five-step plan in helping their friends with mental health challenges.

• Empowering Every Student, Every Day - In 2018, Wheeling CCSD 21 began a journey to assess itself and identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in ensuring equity of educational opportunities and success for all students. This panel will provide insight into how to organize a system to identify and collectively work to implement system-wide improvement.
