Investigated Themes

We noticed that students in grades 3rd-5th grade had lower scores in their rating of whether they liked coming to their class. We looked at all scores that were a 3 or lower and here were the trends:

- Teacher student relationships- 35 responses
- Student to student relationships- 15 responses
- Tired/Fatigue- 22 responses
- Homework/School work- 14 responses
- I don't know- 11 responses
- Exclusion- 10 responses
- Bullying- 5 responses
- Food- 2 responses
- Fighting- 1 response

We wondered what students were saying when they rated below a 4 regarding whether someone on staff loved or cared about them?

- Unsure/Don't Know
- Yelling/Rude
- Too much work
- Leave me out/Ignore me
- Don't listen
- Not helping
- Don't know me
- Hard on me

We were curious about the grade level patterns of the language they used to describe whether they liked class or not...

- Lower grades positives: Fun, friends, art
- Lower grades negatives: Tired, mean
- Upper grade positives: Friends
- Upper grade negatives: Boring, sleepy/tired, bullying
- Math came up a lot as a positive and negative

Signs of less empowerment because many students indicated that they didn't come up with their own ideas in class on a regular basis.

Almost 100% of Kindergarten students said they feel smart, but a lot more variability in grades 1-5.

Recommendations

- More teacher/student bonding time (circles, group inclusive activities)
- More Trauma Enforced training
- A more comfortable/secure way to report students and teachers (bullying, rude/mean staff)
- More positive feedback
- More comfort for non-english speakers (equity & equality)
- More one-on-one time with students
- Diversify approaches to learning
- Fitting students needs more
- Holding staff accountable
- Acknowledge students concerns
- More support for upper-grades (they don't feel smart)
- Teacher builds better relationships with students (make it known they appreciate their students)

Teacher Recommendations

- Put more energy into building relationships with students
- Create a more positive environment
- Listen to the students' worries!
- Make learning fun and enjoyable
- Encourage independent thinking
- Interactive Lessons
- Brain breaks
- One-on-one student to teacher help
- Encourage questions
- Targeting specific student needs
 - Help with reading, math, etc
 - Specified learning help based on subject need
