Faculty regularly holds study sessions and study clubs on weekdays and weekends throughout the school year. 100% of our core courses participate. We hold approximately 150 per annum.</p> <p>Faculty creates course syllabi each term ensuring academic programs are aligned with state frameworks. Faculty has created their own courses and had them approved by the ADE. Faculty is extremely enthusiastic and able to provide assistance during directed study to those scholars with review of materials. Through regular teacher observations and evaluations, our Pathwise coordinator/mentor assists faculty in incorporating various teaching techniques to assist scholars with different learning styles. Faculty meets as departments bi-weekly to effectively integrate cross-discipline assignments.</p>	<p>Academics is the core of Haas Hall Academy. Academic Improvement Plans, tutoring, and study sessions are fundamental reasons for our academic successes.</p>

	<p>Faculty enhance the learning environment through bringing in professionals as guest speakers to create a reference with classroom material to real world projects. Faculty inform parents on a regular basis of scholar progress in their classes by personal contact, written correspondence and phone calls.</p> <p>Standardized test scores are used to identify subject area strengths and weaknesses. Data from these exams is evaluated by faculty twice a year to identify strengths and areas for additional focus. 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	<p>Haas Hall Academy's Academic Intervention Plan (AIP) intervenes and tracks the academic progress of scholars deemed in academic jeopardy. Academic jeopardy is defined as a scholar with a 'D' or below in any course.</p> <p>Scholars in academic jeopardy, along with their parent(s) or guardian must attend a weekly academic progress meeting held each Tuesday from 2:30 – 3:30 p.m. Scholars and their parent(s) or guardian will meet with faculty and administration to prepare an AIP.</p> <p>The AIP is created, modified and monitored by faculty. Faculty establishes benchmarks that must be met on a weekly basis and evidence of academic improvement from the scholar must be demonstrated.</p> <p>Scholars involved in AIP must also attend study club Wednesday & Thursday afternoons from 2:20 – 3:30 p.m. Scholars involved in AIP may not</p>	
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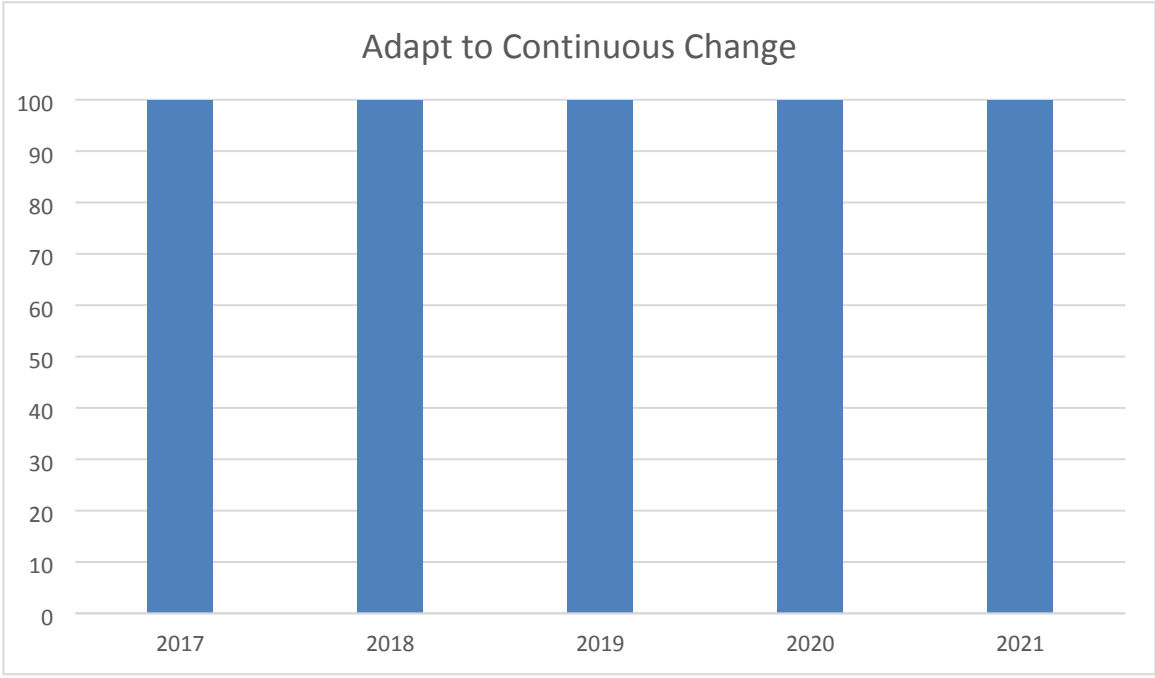
