MEAP-Access and MI-Access Social Studies Assessments for Grades 6, 9, and 11

Background

Michigan does not currently offer an alternate assessment for social studies; therefore, students who take the Fall 2012 MI-Access and MEAP-Access assessments, based on their Individualized Education Program (IEP), must be administered a local assessment for social studies. This local assessment is then reported to the Bureau of Assessment & Accountability during the 'Students Not Tested' window. School districts should have a local policy about which social studies assessment will be used and have local school board-adopted proficiency standards for the local assessment.

The Bureau of Assessment & Accountability has begun work to develop a MI-Access Functional Independence (FI) assessment in social studies and expects that the first operational Functional Independence social studies assessment will be administered in spring, 2014.

Additional Pertinent Information

- This process will be in effect for fall of 2012 and spring of 2013 only as the state plans to have assessments in place by the spring 2014 test administration.

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Recommended Process

MI-Access Social Studies Assessment

- Students for whom participation in the MI-Access Social Studies assessment has been recommended
 by their IEP team and who receive their primary instruction in social studies in a special education
 class will be assessed via the benchmark assessments in the <u>Unique Learning Systems curriculum</u>
 utilized in each or our MiCI programs.
 - *Proficiency Standard*: A score of 12/18 (66%) on each of the *Content Understanding* strands of the assessment as documented for the student in May of the year prior to the fall state assessment window (6^{th} and 9^{th} grade) or in February prior to the spring state assessment (11^{th} grade).
- Students for whom participation in the MI-Access Social Studies assessment has been recommended
 by their IEP team and who receive their primary instruction in social studies in a general education
 class will be assessed via modified unit assessments from the general education social studies class
 in which they participate.

Proficiency Standard: A score of 70% or higher on each of the unit assessments administered in the school year prior to the fall state assessment window (6th and 9th grade) or in the semester prior to the spring state assessment (11th grade).

MEAP-Access Social Studies Assessment

- 1. Students for whom participation in the MEAP-Access Social Studies assessment has been recommended by their IEP team will be assessed via unit assessments from the general education social studies class in which they participate.
 - *Proficiency Standard*: A score of 60% or higher on each of the unit assessments administered in the school year prior to the fall state assessment window (6th and 9th grade). Accommodations per the student's IEP may be utilized.
