Preschool Program Audit – Parent Information

Dear Families,

We want to let you know that our preschool will be participating in an upcoming program audit. This is a routine review that helps ensure our school continues to provide a safe, supportive, and high-quality learning environment for all children.

What is the audit for?

The audit looks at many parts of our program, including:

- Classroom learning environments
- Health and safety practices
- Curriculum and lesson planning
- Staff qualifications and training
- Family communication and involvement

When will it happen?

The audit is scheduled for December 2nd-17th

What does this mean for your child?

There will be no changes to your child's daily routine. Classrooms will operate as usual. Auditors may briefly observe activities, look at materials, or review documentation, but they do not interact directly with children.

What do families need to do?

No action is required from parents at this time. If we need any additional forms or updates, we will let you know in advance.

Why is this important?

These reviews help us:

- Maintain high program standards
- Identify strengths and areas for improvement
- Ensure we are meeting all licensing and quality requirements

- Continue providing the best possible early learning experience

Wellness Tips

❖ Healthy Habits

- **Snack Smart:** Offer fruits, veggies, and whole grains. Keep sugary treats occasional.
- **Hydration Reminder:** Kids need water throughout the day—send a labeled reusable water bottle.

▬ Rest & Routine

- **Sleep Counts:** Preschoolers need 10–13 hours of sleep each night. Consistent bedtimes help regulate emotions and energy.
- **Morning Calm:** Build in 10 extra minutes each morning for a peaceful start to the day

☒ Clean & Care

- **Handwashing Matters:** Reinforce washing hands before meals and after using the bathroom to prevent colds and bugs.
- **Teach Tissues:** Help your child practice sneezing or coughing into their elbow and using tissues independently.

☒ Move & Play

- **Outside Every Day:** 20–30 minutes of outdoor play supports mood, sleep, and focus.
- **Dance Breaks:** A quick dance party after school can shake off stress and boost joy.

♥ Emotional Wellness

- **Name the Feeling:** Help your child label their emotions ("You're feeling frustrated because..."). This builds emotional intelligence.
- **Quiet Moments:** Create a calm-down space at home with a soft pillow or favorite book for when your child feels overwhelmed.
