Board Report May 22, 2017

1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. From PBIS: The grade levels with the least number of Behavior Reports (B.R.) for this past month were: 11th grade (9 B.R.)—(3rd month won this semester), 10th grade (10 B.R.)—(4th month won this semester) and the 8th grade (9 B.R.)—(2nd month won this semester). The students in these grades will receive a special treat this month as well as the Ranger Way "You're A Class Act" banner being hung in their locker bay! The "treat or reward" gets bigger the more times a class wins the monthly contest each semester. In Grades 7-12, there were 65 B.R. for the month. This is less than the 101 Behavior Reports last school year for the month of April. Year-to-date totals are: 543 for 2016-17 and 694 for 2015-16. Our goal is to have 80% (or higher) of the students in grades 7-12 with zero or one Behavior Report. At the end of the month, we had 82% of the students in that category. After May 10, we were at 81.4% so we met our goal!!
- ii. Handle with Care Training was conducted by Paul Bunyan COOP staff for the CRES and High School's Crisis Teams. This training was conducted in four-hour sessions in two parts: April 25—Verbal Interventions and April 26—Physical Interventions and Restraints.
- iii. On Thursday, April 27, Mrs. Andersen's Service Adventure Leadership Team (S.A.L.T.) sponsored a "We are Silent Day" and on Friday, April 28th, S.A.L.T. hosted a blood drive for High School students and staff as well as for the community as a whole.
- iv. On May 1st, we held the Senior Awards Program in the Mayberry Auditorium. The following are some of the highlights:
 - 1. \$136,275.00 in local scholarships were awarded to members of the Class of 2017. Shayla Loiland and Austin Davis were the 61st and 62nd C-I Student to earn an "Alworth Memorial Scholarship" worth \$20,000.00. Students who earn this scholarship have a high aptitude for science and math and declare they are pursuing a career in a related field.
 - 2. There were 29 Seniors (40.2% of the graduates) who completed at least one Bridge's Career Academy. The Academies completed include: Natural Resources (19 students), Automotive Technology (6 students), Health Sciences (3 students), Human Services (3 students), Business (3 students), Culinary (3 students), Construction / Design (1 student) and Graphic Arts (1 student). Ten students completed two Career Academies! We also met our goal of having at least 40% of the seniors completing a Bridges Career Academy!!!
 - 3. Jama Davidson (Career Counselor) presented certificates to 33 seniors who took the assessment for the National Career Readiness Certification (NCRC). This is over twice as many as last year when there were 15 students who took the exam. C-I seniors had the following data: 8 Bronze, 21 Silver and 4 Gold Certificates. If a student has a Silver or higher NCRC

- certification, businesses like Clow Stamping Company, Lakeland Mold, etc. will grant an automatic interview.
- 4. We have Co-Valedictorians this year! Nikita Finnerty and Sage Stangel were tied with a perfect GPA. Noah Gindorff is the Salutatorian for the Class of 2017.
