Schools have cut budgets and personnel and many staff are doing several jobs. We know that if there were an efficient processes for school improvement in place it would save time and effort. The first step is getting superintendents and principals to push for implementation. The general education department will continue to advocate for this through our work with teachers and administrators.

Homeless McKinney-Vento Grant Last year we signed on to this grant facilitated by Mecosta-Osceola ISD which provides us support in offering services to homeless youth, grant funds, and meeting state documentation requirements. They have also visited MAPS and will visit KND to assist in homeless service efforts and compliance.
