#5144.4 1 2 Physical Activity, Undirected Play and Student Discipline 3 4 It is the policy of the Board to promote the health and well-being of district students by 5 encouraging healthy lifestyles including promoting physical exercise and activity as part of the 6 school day. 7 It is the policy of the Madison Board of Education (the "Board") to promote the health and 8 well-being of district students by encouraging healthy lifestyles including promoting physical 9 exercise and activity as part of the school day. 10 For the purposes of this policy, a "school employee" is defined as (1) a teacher, substitute 11 12 teacher, school administrator, school superintendent, guidance counselor, school counselor, 13 psychologist, social worker, nurse, physician, school paraprofessional or coach employed by the 14 Board or working in the district schools, or (2) any other individual who, in the performance of 15 his or hertheir duties, has regular contact with students and who provides services to or on behalf of students enrolled in the district schools pursuant to a contract with the Board. 16 17 18 **Prohibition on Deprivation of Physical Exercise Period or Undirected Play Period as a** 19 Form of Discipline: 20 21 For elementary school students, the Board includes a time of not less than twenty (20) minutes in 22 total, during the regular school day, to be devoted to physical exercise, except that a planning and placement team ("PPT") may develop a different schedule for students requiring special 23 24 education and related services. 25 26 The administration may include additional time, beyond the twenty minutes required for physical 27 exercise, devoted to undirected play during the regular school day for elementary school students. 28 29 In an effort to promote physical exercise and undirected play, the Board prohibits school 30 employees from disciplining elementary school students by preventing them from participating in 31 the full 20 minutes of time devoted to physical exercise or additional time devoted to undirected 32 play during the regular school day, except in accordance with this policy or as determined by a

33	student's Section 504 team or PPT. instances where the student's behavior poses a health and/o			
34 35	safety concern or as determined by a student's Section 504 or planning and placement team.			
36 37	A. Physical Exercise Period			
38	School employees may prevent or otherwise restrict a student from participating in the entire			
39	time devoted to physical exercise in the regular school day as a form of discipline only under			
40 41	the following circumstances:			
42 43 44	1) When a student poses a danger to the health or safety of other students or school personnel; or			
45 46 47 48 49 50	2) If there are two or more periods devoted to physical exercise in a school day,then when the prevention or restriction of physical exercise is limited to the period devoted to physical exercise that is the shortest in duration, provided that the student still participates in at least twenty minutes of physical exercisein a school day.			
51	School employees may prevent or restrict a student from participating in the entire time			
52	devoted to physical exercise in the regular school day as a form of discipline, in accordance			
53	with this policy, only one time during a school week, unless the student is a danger to the			
54 55	health or safety of other students or school personnel.			
56	School employees may not prevent or restrict a student from participating in the entire time			
57	devoted to physical exercise in the regular school day if such prevention or restrictionis related to			
58 59	the student's failure to complete school work on time or to the student's academic performance			
60	This policy distinguishes between a) discipline that is imposed before the time devoted to			
61	physical exercise begins and b) discipline imposed during such time devoted to physical			
62	exercise or methods used to redirect a student's behavior during such time. School personne			
63	may impose discipline during time devoted to physical exercise as a result of student's behavior			
64	during such time, if such discipline is in accordance with Board policies and procedures. School			
65	personnel may also use methods to redirect a student's behavior, in the event such behavior			
66	warrants redirection, during the time devoted to physical exercise. For clarity, the prohibition			
67	against preventing or restricting a student's participation in the time devoted to physical			

68	exercise shall apply to student conduct that occurs prior to the physical exercise time, rather		
69	than during the physical exercise time.

71 72	B. Undirected Play Period		
73	School employees may not discipline elementary school students by preventing them from		
74	participating in the full time devoted to undirected play, if any, during the regular schoolda		
75	except when a student poses a danger to the health or safety of other students or school		
76	personnel, or as determined by a student's Section 504 team or PPT.		
77			
78	Prohibition on Compulsion of Physical Activity as a Form of Discipline:		
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80	For all students, the Board prohibits school employees from disciplining students by requiring		
81	students to engage in physical activity as a form of discipline during the regular school day.		
82			
83	Definition:		
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85	For the purposes of this policy, a "school employee" is defined as (1) a teacher, substitute		
86	teacher, school administrator, school superintendent, guidance counselor, school counselor,		
87	psychologist, social worker, nurse, physician, school paraprofessional or coach employed by the		
88	Board or working in the district schools, or (2) any other individual who, in the performance of		
89	his or her duties, has regular contact with students and who provides services to or on behalf or		
90	students enrolled in the district schools pursuant to a contract with the Board.		
91			
92	Disciplinary Action for Failure to Follow Policy:		
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94	Any employee who fails to comply with the requirements of this policy may be subject to		
95	discipline, up to and including termination of employment. Any contracted individual who		
96	provides services to or on behalf of students enrolled in the district and who fails to comply with		
97	the requirements of this policy may be subject to having his/her_the individual's contract fo		
98	services suspended by the district.
