Presentations/ Recognitions

The Ryan High School Business Professionals of America (BPA) Parliamentary Procedure Team placed among the top 10 teams at the parliamentary procedures competition at the 2015 National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, CA. This marks the 10th time in 10 years the Ryan team has advanced to the national competition. The BPA Parliamentary Procedures competition is two-fold, requiring students to sit for a written exam that covers the rules and procedures that govern meetings. Then, judges present the team a scenario and they are required to conduct a meeting on the spot with only 15-minutes of preparation.

The Guyer High School Business Professionals of America (BPA) Financial Analyst Team placed third in the financial analyst competition at the 2015 National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, CA. The competition requires teams to make decisions and recommendations using financial reports and prepare reports. They determine trends, or make projections, or prepare

budgets based upon a case study, and then present findings to a panel of judges.

Guyer High School senior Eliza Price has been named to the Texas Association of Secondary School Principal's All-State Academic Excellence Team, an honor annually bestowed upon only 50 students from across the state. Students for the academic team were selected from nominations made by high school principals based on SAT or ACT scores, academic grade point averages, and pursuits of advanced diplomas.

Ryan High School swimmer Austin Pyrch represented Denton ISD and Ryan High at the UIL Class 6A State Swimming and Diving Championships at the University of Texas at Austin in February. Ryan finished with the fourth-best qualifying team for the state meet and finished among the best 15 swimmers in the state in his event, the 50-meter freestyle.

Denton ISD's three comprehensive high schools recently qualified athletes to compete at the UIL Class 6A and 5A State Track and Field Championships at the University of Texas at Austin earlier this month. Denton High qualified a relay team for the 5A state meet, while Guyer and Ryan qualified individuals. And while none of the athletes medaled, they finished among the top eight teams or individuals in the state and represented the district with class.

2015-2016 Budget Discussion Debbie Monschke, Asst. Superintendent for Administrative Services reviewed the updated projected revenue for the 2015-2016 school year. She pointed out that under the current funding formula as local property taxes increase, state funding for the district will decrease. The proposed budget contains an increase of \$3.9 million for the related cost increase due compensation and benefits. The final total of the proposed budget is \$223 million with an excess of \$2.1 million.

Discussion of Compensation Plan Dr. Richard Valenta, Deputy Superintendent reviewed Denton's proposed compensation plan as it compares to our Market districts. The main goals of the plan are to recruit and retain good employees; recognize job value and responsibility and reward continued service and keep cost efficient and effective. The proposed starting teacher salary for 2015-2016 is \$50,000. The proposal includes at least a \$1,250 increase for every current teacher, with the entire plan proposing a two percent increase of the mid-point for employees.

The results will be disaggregated to determine community values, which will drive the construction of a second, more detailed survey in the areas emphasized by survey results. Denton ISD/TWU College Student Success Initiative Partnership David Hicks, Exec. Director Secondary Academic Programs provided the Board with information on an upcoming potential partnership between the district and Texas Woman's University for qualifying students to gain guaranteed admission to TWU upon meeting the necessary requirements. This will provide more Denton ISD students with immediate access to post-secondary education opportunities.

- Juniors who rank in the top 30 percent of their graduating class, meet all Texas Success Initiatives (TSI) requirements, submit their ACT/SAT scores and complete the application process receiving automatic admission into TWU.
- TWU providing high school campuses with assistance on admissions, financial aid applications and the importance/transference of AP and dual-credit courses on a regular basis.
- TWU providing a minimum of one TSI testing opportunity at each district high school and the LaGrone Advanced Technology Complex.

• TWU will provide a \$2,000 scholarship to each high school to award an eligible junior beginning in the Fall of 2016.
