## **Grandparents Raising Grandkids/Kinship (a program within āisspōōmmoōtsiiyō•p)** **Kinship Program & Aging Mastery Program-**

I made contact with our kinship families to ensure their students had access to summer school information and were registered for summer school. I was also able to provide summer camp opportunities and information. When we receive referrals for families or students who may need our services or support, our initial conversations include very tough questions. Although some families seek out our services and support on their own for very specific things and may not need additional services, it is very difficult for them to ask for help.

### **McKinney Vento (MV):**

I held an end-of-school give-a-way for our McKinney Vento, Kinship families, YHDP students, Foster Care, and Teen parents. Just as an end of school year check-in with these individuals and families. I wanted to recognize all of them for not only accessing our supportive services but for also doing their best at balancing all “life” things, education/employment, and for working towards achieving their goals. I was also able to identify ways we can improve our communication strategies with our families.

In addition, I distributed over 89 “Thank You” cards to individuals who’ve donated to our efforts during this past school year. I would not be able to fully provide the support to our families without the donations we received. Lastly, I distributed our PCOP application and outreach materials to our community partners so that they may include them and distribute to families who may need our services for the next school year. We will gather the applications in July when I return.
