Comprehensive Needs Assessment – Demographics

Aledo ISD is a PPCD - 12th grade school district located in Parker and Tarrant Counties. There are nine campuses in the district consisting of four elementary campuses through grade 4; one intermediate campus, grades 5-6; one middle school, grades 7-8; one ninth grade campus, one high school, grades 10-12; and one alternative campus.

The district has three Title I campuses: Vandagriff Elementary, Coder Elementary, and McCall Elementary.

Our total student enrollment for the 2015-2016 school year was 5,025. Our projected enrollment for 2016-2017 school year is 5,486.

The student population for the 2015-2016 school is ethnically represented as follows: African American – 1.7%; Hispanic – 12.1%; White – 82.7%; Native American – .5%; Asian – .7%; Two or more ethnicities – 2.4%.

For the 2015-2016 school year, 12.9% of the student population is Economically Disadvantaged, 2.7% is English Language Learners (ELL), 22.5% is Career and Technical Education, 6.7% is Special Education, and 6.4% is Gifted and Talented. The district served 4 immigrant students during the school year, and we served 37 homeless students, an increase of 5 homeless students from the previous year. The district also served 6 students in foster care.

The number of dropouts reported for 2014-2015 was 4 students.

During the 2015-2016 school year, the district had a total staff of 533.5 consisting of teachers, professional support, campus administration, and central office administration compared to 516 in 2014-2015. The turnover rate for staff decreased from 14% (2014-2015) to 13.6% (2015-2016). The teacher turn-over rate decreased from 9.7% (2014 – 2015) to 8% (2015-2016).
