## **PURPOSE/PRIORITIES:**

- Focus on student literacy, supporting efforts to develop highly proficient writers and readers
- Focus on mathematics, supporting efforts to increase the number of students successfully completing AGS1
- Provide a common, minimum experience for all students
- Encourage student exploration
  - o 6th Grade: Allow for all students to explore elective courses
- Allow for student access and choice
  - o 7th and 8th Grade: Allow for all students to access and have greater choice in the elective courses
