Academic Intervention within the School Day Successful

Our teachers require selected students to attend an academic intervention just prior to students' lunch time. This highly successful program has been underway since the third week of school, where 90-120 students are called into our teachers' classrooms Monday through Thursday to make up missing work or sharpen the skills and knowledge needed to pass proficiency assessments.

Students are required to attend these sessions, while their peers, who are in good academic standing, attend intramurals, where a weekly regimen of dodge ball, basketball, kick ball, wall ball, walk and talk, and indoor soccer take place. On Friday, all students get to enjoy intramurals.

Student Leaders Benefit Their School

The Fleming student leadership group has been busy since their selection in the fall. Students were selected based upon scholarship, behavior, attendance, recommendation from staff and/or community members, or Principal Appointment.

This group of students has taken the lead in many areas, including assisting in fund raising for the school, producing dances, organizing school-wide assemblies to celebrate good behavior, and developing and implementing Spirit Weeks.

Fleming's counselor, Cassie Banuelos, and Office Manager Kym Woolsey advise and mentor these fine student leaders.

OAKS Testing Underway

Another year of OAKS testing is underway at Fleming. Our students work hard to prepare for these assessments, and our staff has worked hard to emphasize their importance.

Fleming students understand OAKS assessments are beneficial to them. These assessments are an important measurement on student progress from year to year – and their results help students and their parents know if students are working at grade level. OAKS results also indicate students' strong areas in a given subject, as well as areas in which students need to work harder to get over the bar.
