

Key Points

District emergency response protocol & Law Enforcement resulted in the following actions:

- All schools were locked down immediately by administration.
- Law enforcement presence at all sites were students present.
- Communications were coordinated through law enforcement.
 - Accuracy of communications critical
 - Occurred promptly <u>once</u> law enforcement provided go ahead
- Family reunification was prioritized across the district.
